THE STE Update of Iowa Birdline (319)338-9881 for 9/18/91 From Iowa City, the adult male PEREGRINE FALCON that was atop the Northwestern Bell building downtown on the 17th, was back the evening of the 18th sitting on the northeast corner on the Burlington St. side. Other reports were all from central Iowa. In Polk Co., Pam Allen had a male BLACK THROATED BLUE WARBLER in her West Des Moines backyard. At the beach of the Sandpiper Recreation Area of the Saylorville Reservoir there were only three shorebird species, but what a trio....18 AMERICAN AVOCETS, a RUDDY TURNSTONE, and a PIPING PLOVER. In Hardin Co., a RED SHOULDERED HAWK was in a familiar location about four miles west of Union where county road D-65 crosses a wooded creek valley. In Marshall Co., 120 raptors were seen passing over Grammer Grove Park near Liscomb, with a PEREGRINE FALCON and three MERLINS among them.

> In news from the 17th in southeast Iowa at Cone Marsh in Louisa Co., three SHARP TAILED SPARROWS were located along the main east-west dike, and a BLACK CROWNED NIGHT HERON was on the east side.

In a September 16th report from Dubuque, in the marsh behind the John Deere plant, there were several warbler and vireo species, including YELLOW THROATED VIREO, as well as LECONTE'S and SHARP TAILED SPARROWS, 2 AMERICAN BITTERS, a SORA, CASPIAN TERNS, and 2 OSPREYS. Most of the state's birding activity this past weekend took place in the south central in conjunction with the fall IOU meeting held near Indianola. Field trips produced 134 total species.

At Lake Red Rock, an OSPREY and a WHITE FRONTED GOOSE were found. At the Runnells Wildlife Area near the hiway 316 overlook, a male and female PEREGRINE FALCON team stole the show harassing the shorebirds and anything else in the vicinity. Twenty shorebird species were counted there, with the highlights including a large concentration of STILT SANDPIPERS, all the PEEPS, a WILLET, a RUDDY TURNSTONE, both DOWITCHER species, and at least two BUFF BREASTED SANDPIPERS. Also spotted there were an OSPREY, CASPIAN TERNS, and a SHARP TAILED SPARROW. The refuge area beyond the gate there is now closed to entry through December 25. Woodland birding in the area at locations which included Lake Ahquabi State Park and Woodland Mounds Preserve in Warren Co., was mediocre, with only 13 warbler species, OLIVE SIDED and YELLOW BELLIED FLYCATCHERS, CAROLINA WREN, BELL'S VIREO, and an early WHITE THROATED SPARROW.
