Go in the west entrance, and proceed as far as you can go, and the birds were in a row of pines to the southwest.

In the south-central in the Red Rock Reservoir area of Marion County on the 20th, a first year THAYER'S GULL was at Roberts Creek Lake, twenty BONAPARTE'S GULLS and a lingering WHITE PELICAN were below the dam, and the lone TREE SWALLOW was still over the small pond along county road G-28 near Cordova Park.
