The WESTERN FLYCATCHER (Sp.), which would represent a first state record, has not been reported from Ahquabi State Park now since the 15th. The best birds this week are both in central Iowa, BLACK SCOTER and RED CROSSBILL.

In the central, a female BLACK SCOTER was on the lake at Crown Point Development in Johnston, just north of Des Moines, at least through the 21st. To reach this area, from hiway #401 just north of I-80, go west on Pioneer Parkway. A flock of RED CROSSBILLS was at Dale Moffitt Reservoir southwest of Des Moines on the 21st. Go in the west entrance, and proceed as far as you can go, and the birds were in a row of pines to the southwest.

In the south-central in the Red Rock Reservoir area of Marion County on the 20th, a first year THAYER'S GULL was at Roberts Creek Lake, twenty BONAPARTE'S GULLS and a lingering WHITE PELICAN were below the dam, and the lone TREE SWALLOW was still over the small pond along county road G-28 near Cordova Park.

In the northeast, an expotic popped up in Oelwein...a pair of RINGED TURTLE DOVES at the feeder of Barb Roberson, whose phone number is (319)283-5133.

In the southeast, a LONG-EARED OWL has been seen along the east entrance road at Geode State Park in Henry County.
