ON THE 9TH - TIM SCHWARTZ REPORTS THE CHIPPING SPARROW WHICH HAS BEEN AT HIS FEEDER ALL WINTER IS STILL THERE, AND THIS MORNING HE HAD A COMMON NIGHTHAWK FLYING OVER HIS HOME AT THE NORTH OAK ROCK STATE PARK RANGERS HOUSE IN THE SOUTHEAST

AT THE HAWKEYE WILDLIFE AREA IN TOWNSHIP COUNTY ON THE 8TH, 15 DUCK SPECIES WERE COUNTED AND EARLY FIELD SPARROWS WERE SEEN AND AT CEDAR LAKE IN CEDAR RAPIDS THERE WERE 4 HORNED GREBES ON THE 9TH.

IN HENRY COUNTY THE 3 LONG EARED OWLS WERE STILL AT GEORGE STATE PARK JUST INSIDE THE EAST ENTRANCE ON THE 8TH. LOOK IN CEDAR TREES SOUTH OF THE ROAD. AT CONE MARSH IN LOUISA COUNTY ON THE 8TH, TEN DUCK SPECIES, AND 4 GOOSE SPECIES, INCLUDING WHITE FRONTED AND ROSS' WERE PRESENT

(1) ON THE 11TH, THE DRAKE CHAMON TEAL WAS STILL PRESENT AT M'CORD POND IN BUTLER COUNTY, IN THE MIDDLE INLET ON THE WEST SIDE. IN TOWNSHIP COUNTY, THERE WERE 11 DUCK SPECIES AT SWAN LAKE AND THE NORTHERN SAW WHET OWL WAS STILL PRESENT IN CEDARS ON THE NORTH SIDE OF COUNTY ROAD F20 0.7 MILE WEST OF THE HAWKEYE WILDLIFE AREA HEADQUARTERS

Iowa Birdline (319)338-9881 for 3/9/92
Very early sightings last week, triggered by the spring weather included a BARN SWALLOW in Tama County, and a YELLOWLEGS (Sp.) in Louisa County. Other early migrants reported for the first time this spring included TURKEY VULTURE, EASTERN PHOEBE, BLUE-WINGED TEAL, and FOX SPARROW. Other highlights were CINNAMON TEAL at two locations, a SNOWY OWL in the southwest, and a WHITE-WINGED CROSSBILL in the southeast.

In the southwest, in Fremont County, eight duck species, including a CINNAMON TEAL, and four gesse, including a ROSS' were at Forney Lake on the 6th. For more information, call Roger Rose at (712)527-3380. At Council Bluffs, a SNOWY OWL was observed in the area north of Lake Manawa on the 4th, but no further sightings have been reported.

In central Iowa on the 8th, a drake CINNAMON TEAL was discovered at McCord Pond, which is about two miles southwest of Bayard in northern Guthrie County. Scope the area from the south road. A total of seventeen duck species was seen at Bay's Branch and Lakin Slough, also in Guthrie County. For more information, call Maridel Jackson at (515)969-0140. Three RED SHOULDERED HAWKS were reported; on the 4th west of Boone, and on the 5th south of Union in Hardin County, and at Union Grove State Park in Tama County. Thirteen duck species were counted at Little Wall Lake in Hamilton County on the 7th.

In the southeast, since February 13th, a male WHITE-WINGED CROSSBILL has been at the feeder of Margaret Bailey, who lives along hiway 61 north of Montrose in Lee County. You can call her at (319)463-5694. In Johnson County, the NORTHERN SAW-WHET OWL was still at Lake MacBride State Park on the 7th. Look in the conifer grove on the west side of the road which goes to the south shore of the north arm of the lake.

In the northeast in Allamakee County an immature GOLDEN EAGLE was seen along county road A-26 southwest of New Albin on the 5th. And, according to Jim Hodges, near Bellevue in Jackson County, there is one pair of BALD EAGLES in the nesting process along the Mississippi River south of town, and three other pairs that are possibel nesters.

In the east-central in Scott County, ten duck species, and a SHRIKE described as a NORTHERN, were at Princeton Marsh on the 8th.
