The birding this past weekend was confined to Christmas counts, and there were some excellent finds, including two SNOWY OWLS, a TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRE, and a GREAT BLACK-BACKED GULL.

In the north-central, highlights of the Mason City count on the 19th were FIELD, LINCOLN'S, and SWAMP SPARROWS, NORTHERN SHRIKE, SNOW BUNTING, GOLDEN-CROWNED KINGLET, and TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRE. To look for the SOLITAIRE, go south of Rock Falls on Cerro Gordo County road S-62 for one mile, and then east on 295th Street for a mile and a half. Park just west of a cement bridge, walk south about 200 yards, and look in cedar trees. The bird was relocated in about the same spot on the 20th. This is a public area, but it is still deer hunting season. For more information, call Curt Nelson at (515)696-5600.

In the northeast in Bremer County on the 19th, a SNOWY OWL was found on the Bremer-Blackhawk County line, two and a half miles east of hiway #63. For more information, call Francis Moore at (319)232-0217. At Cedar Rapids, 65 species were recorded on the 19th, with a RED-SHOULDERED HAWK in the village of Robins, GOLDEN-CROWNED KINGLET, LOGGERHEAD SHRIKE, and an adult NORTHERN GOSHAWK at the Cedar Rapids Nursery, 2100 Wilson Avenue. Park by the buildings, and walk to the back of the nursery, and look in a stand of evergreens on the left. For more information, call Jim Durbin at (319)377-7194.

In the central in Polk County on the Saylorville Count on the 20th, highlights were a SNOWY OWL and NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD at Big Creek State Park, an amazing four NORTHERN GOSHAWKS, five YELLOW-RUMPED WARBLERS. a MERLIN at Sandpiper Beach, LOGGERHEAD SHRIKE, SNOW BUNTING, and WINTER WREN. *FOR MORE INFORMATION, CALL MARK PROPERGLOTT (515)496-529*

In the south-central, the Red Rock count in Marion County on the 19th featured two GLAUCOUS GULLS, one below and one above the dam, two THAYER'S GULLS below the dam, and a third year GREAT BLACK-BACKED GULL in Whitebreast Bay. There were also a WHITE PELICAN in Whitebreast Bay, GREATER SCAUP, and SNOW BUNTING. For more information, call Tim Schantz at (515) 627-5935.

In the southeast, Burlington's 76 species shattered their old record by five. Highlights were all three ACCIPITERS, all three MERGANSERS, HORNED GREBE, THAYER'S GULL, WINTER WREN, RED-SHOULDERED HAWK, NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD, 17 EURASIAN TREE SPARROWS, AND 47 great blue herons, BUT only 28 MALLARDS. Iowa City's count was on the 20th, and they checked in with 63 species, which included two PINE WARBLERS around the Hancher Auditorium parking lot, MERLIN, NORTHERN GOSHAWK, FIELD SPARROW, NORTHERN SAW-WHET OWL,

WINTER WREN, and GOLDEN-CROWNED KINGLET. For more information, call Tom Kent at (319)337-5231. Also in the southeast, an immature SWAN (Sp.) was at Cone Marsh in Louisa County on the 18th.

In the northwest, Ida County had 47 species on the 19th, with the best birds GREATER WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE, MERLIN, LONG-EARED OWL, both KINGLETS, RED-BREASTED NUTHATCH, and SNOW BUNTINGS. For more information, call Pete Erzen at (712)364-2183. Jim Fuller (319)338-3561
