Some winter finches, namely PINE SISKIN and PURPLE FINCH, have been widely reported the past week or two. This week's highlights are WHITE-FACED IBIS and SANDHILL CRANE in the west, and SABINE'S GULL and WESTERN GREBE at Red Rock.

In the west in Monona County, three WHITE-FACED IBIS and eight BLACK-BELLIED PLOVER were in a small wet area in a field which is along hiway 175 a quarter mile west of I-29 on the 23rd. A mile west of I-29 on the south side of hiway 175 at Blue Lake, a SANDHILL CRANE was present on the 22rd, but was not seen on the 23rd.

In the south-central in Marion County, the juvenile SABINE'S GULL discovered on the 21rst was still there on the 22nd. The location is reached by going north on county road S-71 toward the Whitebreast Recreation Area. At the Coalport Church turn right and at Lakeview veer left. The bird was 200 yards off the point there. There were also three WESTERN GREBES and eight COMMON LOONS at that location on the 22nd. Below the Red Rock dam on the way to the Dollar Bridge in a wet field at the Van Dusseldorp Quarry, there were 17 BLACK-BELLIED PLOVERS on the 23rd.

In the central in Marshall County, five CATTLE EGRETS were at the gravel pit along E. Main Street just east of Marshalltown on the 24th, and a HARLAN'S RED-TAILED HAWK has been seen for a week now near the intersection of hiway 330 and county road E-35 west of Marshalltown. In Jasper County in the Oswolt Bridge area west of Colfax, there were fifteen LESSER GOLDEN PLOVER, and two AMERICAN PIPITS on the 23rd.

In the southeast in Johnson County, 100 shorebirds of six species, the majority of which were DUNLIN, were at the Coralville Reservoir on the north side of the Swan Lake Road, a half mile west of its intersection with the Greencastle Road on the 22nd.
