The highlight is the continued presence of a REDDISH EGRET in the central part of the state.

The REDDISH EGRET was still being seen at least through the 12th near Colfax in Jasper County. This immature bird was discovered by Tim Schantz the evening of the 5th. To look for this bird, from I-80 take hiway 117 south into Colfax to the junction with county road F-48, where you go west on F-48 for about a mile past the Casey's Store. Then turn north on gravel, cross the railroad tracks, and after the road turns west continue to where the power lines cross the road. On the 11th, the bird was in a wet area on the north side of the road there. Earlier in the week, it had been in the field to the north as soon as the road turns west, but that area has pretty well dried up. Also seen there on the 7th were a PEREGRINE FALCON, BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPERS, and LESSER GOLDEN PLOVER, *AND ON THE 12TH 2 MERLINS.*

In Tama County, Mike Stegmann reported three RED-BREASTED NUTHATCHES at his feeder near Garwin on the 10th.

In the north-central in Cerro Gordo County, warblers which included GOLDEN-WINGED, a RED-BREASTED NUTHATCH, and SEDGE WRENS were at Lime Creek Nature Center on the 8th.
