Iowa Birdline (319)338-9881 for 4/27/92 An exciting time of year. For the second week in a row, we had a record number of reports to the Birdline, resulting in a record ten updates.

On the 26th, there were two reports of BLACK RAIL, one near Iowa City, and the other at Des Moines. In addition, the EURASIAN WIGEON was still in Linn County, and other highlights were LITTLE BLUE HERONS in the southeast, SANDHILL CRANE and CINNAMON TEAL in the central, and CHESTNUT-COLLARED LONGSPURS in the southwest. And good birds that put in a very brief appearance last week were LITTLE GULL in the southwest, YELLOW RAIL and WHIMBREL in the central, and IBIS in the northeast.

In the central, two BLACK RAILS were seen on the 26th near Des Moines by Barb Miller and Dick Kraemer. The location is along 70th Avenue, a half mile east of NE 14th Street, and just beyond a Casey's Store. They were in the pond on the north side of the road, and were seen by walking along railroad tracks. For more information, call Barb Miller at (515)255-6059. Elsewhere in the central, a WHIMBREL was discovered by Beth Proescholdt in Marshall County west of Liscomb on the 24th, but was gone before dark that day. At Otter Creek Marsh in Tama County on the 25th, a SANDHILL CRANE, VIRGINIA RAILS, AMERICAN BITTERNS, BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERONS, and a PEREGRINE FALCON were observed, and a YELLOW RAIL was there on the 21rst. Nearby, a mile east of Chelsea, a HUDSONIAN GODWIT was south of county road E-66 a quarter mile along V Street on the 25th. In a marshy area at the east end of Marion Street in Marshalltown, there were a COMMON MOORHEN, an EARED GREBE, CATTLE EGRETS, BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERONS. and AMERICAN BITTERN on the 25th. In Guthrie County, a CINNAMON TEAL was at Lakin Slough on the 25th, and a PRARIE FALCON on the 24th. Two HUDSONIAN GODWITS and a WILLET were just south of the intersection of hiway 141 and county road P-30 on the 25th, and another HUDSONIAN GODWIT was behind the Burger King on First Avenue in Ankeny on the 25th. In Hamilton County, at Anderson Marsh east of Jewell, VIRGINIA RAILS, PEREGRINE FALCON and MERLIN on the 24th., and 13 duck species and BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERONS were at Little Wall Lake on the 23rd. In Story County at the main Colo Pond, 2 and a half miles east of Colo along old hiway 30, there were three WILLETS and a HUDSONIAN GODWIT on the 24th.

In the northeast in Linn County, the EURASIAN WIGEON, discovered by Jim and Joyce Durbin on the 24th was seen by many, and was still present through the 26th. From the 4-way stop on the north edge of Palo, go two miles north, and then go west on gravel to the first road to the north, where the wet area is just around the corner on the west side. If you keep going north on this road you will come to Pleasant Creek State Park in about two miles, where there were 16 duck species, including an EARED GREBE and five HORNED GREBES on the 26th, and a WESTERN GREBE on the 25th. A PEREGRINE FALCON was seen near the Quaker Oats plant in downtown Cedar Rapids on the 25th. In Butler County, a second hand report through the DNR had 25-30 IBISES at Big Marsh north of Parkersburg on the 24th, but gone on the 25th. In Winneshiek County at Cardinal Marsh on the 25th, there were 16 duck species, 40 GREAT EGRETS, a BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERON, a HORNED GREBE, and three WHITE PELICANS.

In the southwest, we have had no further news of the LITTLE GULL discovered on the 23rd near the Iowa Power and Light generating station south of Council Bluffs by B.J. ROSE and Babs Padelford.
