BURLINGTON. THIS AREA SHOULD BE SCOPED, START  
AFTER 5:30 AM UNTIL DARK FROM THE MARINA  
AREA WHICH IS REACHED FROM HIWAY 99. ON THE  
21<sup>ST</sup> HUNDREDS OF GREAT EGRETS AND CATTLE  
EGRETS AS WELL AS 2 SNOWY EGRETS, SEVERAL  
DOZEN LITTLE BLUE HERONS AND 1 IMMATURE  
YELLOW-CROWNED NIGHT HERON.

FIELD <sup>NEAR</sup> SOUTH OF LOUESVILLE. TAKE HIWAY 75  
1 MILE SOUTH OF LOUESVILLE AND GO WEST 0.2  
MILES ON 260<sup>TH</sup> STREET WHERE THERE WERE SEVERAL  
SANDPIPERS AND 0.5 WEST THERE WAS A BUFF  
BREASTED SANDPIPER

Interesting shorebirds have been reported this week, especially in southwest Iowa. In Fremont County, BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPERS have been in a muddy field near Bartlett as late as the 21st. To look for these birds, take the Bartlett exit of I-29, cross the railroad tracks and go north on the first gravel road where the birds have been seen in the first eighth to quarter of a mile. In Pottawattamie County at the north IPL settling pond on the 22nd, the shorebirds included RED-NECKED PHALAROPE, BUFF-BREASTED SANDPIPER, DOWITCHER, STILT SANDPIPER, and BAIRD'S SANDPIPER.

In the central in Marshall County, five AMERICAN AVOCETS and a LEAST TERN were on a mud flat in a bean field which was near a silo at 18th and East Main Street, just east of Marshalltown on the 19th.

In the northwest in Ida County, the cold front of the 19th brought in four warbler species, including BLACKBURNIAN, and LEAST and YELLOW-BELLIED FLYCATCHERS.

In the southeast in Lee County, three OSPREYS were at Victory Park in Keokuk on the 21st.
