The <u>Eurasian Wigeon</u> near Clear Lake in Cerro Gordo County which was discovered by Randy Pinkston on the 18th has not been relocated despite much searching thru the 22nd. In the same area on the 22nd were 16 duck species with lartge numbers of <u>American Wigeons</u>, <u>Canvasbacks</u>, <u>Redheads</u>, <u>and Pintails</u>. There were also <u>White-fronted geese and Snow geese and 4 Northern Harriers and 40 Rusty <u>Blackbirds</u> were counted during the hunt for the <u>Eurasian Wigeon</u>. The <u>Trumpeter Swans</u> in the same area have not been seen since the 17th. Tom Kent reported a <u>Ross' Goose</u> in the same area and one of the Lakin Slough.</u>

In Central Iowa there were <u>White Pelicans</u> at the Runnels Wildlife area and some early <u>cormorants</u> were seen near Tim Schantz's house at Red Rock Reservoir on the 21st. Linda Cambell reported two nesting <u>American Kestrels</u> near Newton just across from the Maytag Dairy farm on the extension of NE 8th street.

At Ledges State Park an early <u>Eastern Kingbird</u> was sighted in the upper part of the park near the prairie on the 21st.

In Johnson county at Lake MacBride there are no new reports of the winter adult <u>Black-legged Kittiwake</u> sighted near the causeway on the 15th but two <u>Boneparte's gulls</u> were seen with <u>Hooded and Redbreasted Mergansers</u>, and <u>Goldeneyes</u> on the 22nd. An early <u>Eared Grebe</u> was on the north arm on the 19th. The <u>Red-shouldered Hawk</u> near the prairie area just south of the causeway was seen again on the 22nd. Another <u>Red-shouldered Hawk</u> was seen from highway F-20 west of the DNR HQ on the 22nd. Some early <u>Pectoral sandpipers</u> were also seen from F-20. A <u>Saw Whet Owl</u> was still present at the Mac Bride Nature Center on the 19th.

At Cone Marsh south of Lone Tree, 20 White-fronted Geese were still present on the 22nd.

At Nauvoo Flats Wildlife Area in Illinois, Bob Cecil found a male Cinnamon Teal about 100 yds south of the parking area on the Alace Class
