This late summer and early fall has brought a major invasion of RED-BREASTED NUTHATCHES into the state with numerous reports the past six weeks. There have been no further reports about last week's top birds, the GYRFALCON and WESTERN GREBE in Dickinson County or the YELLOW RAIL in Greene County.

The week's best bird is a SANDHILL CRANE in the west. Near Onawa in Monona County, a SANDHILL CRANE was seen in a wet field on the south side of hiway 175 a mile west of I-29 on the 1rst.

In the central in Story County on the 2nd, an AMERICAN AVOCET was at the main Colo Pond, which is 2 and a quarter miles east of Colo along county road E-41, and 27 LESSER GOLDEN PLOVER were three miles east and two-thirds of a mile north of Colo on the west side of the road. In Marshall County, 208 raptors, of which 93 were SHARP-SHINNED HAWKS, passed over Grammer Grove Park on the 1rst.
