Migrant warblers and vireos have started pushing back into the state. And Tom Johnson of Centerville has pointed out the importance of the water level at our large reservoirs on shorebirds. When the water level is dropping, shorebird habitat and shorebirds are present, but when rains raise the level, the habitat and the birds disappear. As evidence, there were ten shorebird species, including AMERICAN AVOCETS, at the Island View campground area of Lake Rathbun on the 11th, but with a raising water level, no shorebirds were found on the 13th.

The week's best bird is a WESTERN GREBE in the northwest. In Dickinson County, a WESTERN GREBE was seen on Grover's Lake, which is on the Minnesota-Iowa Border about six miles northwest of the town of Spirit Lake on the 15th.

In the southeast in Johnson County, seven shorebird species and thirty WHITE PELICANS were found at the Coralville Reservoir northeast of Williams Prarie on the 15th, and a RED-BREASTED NUTHATCH was in the Birdline's yard north of Iowa City on the 13th.
