Ihad fewer birds reported this year than in past and many of the better records were from John Robinson and Joe Schaufenbuel who said they would send them directly to you. The early semester system didn't help me as we were in final exams the week after the IOU meeting and that was the peak warbler week here in Ames.

although there was lots of shorebird habitat, I had few records reported to me.
