② IN THE SOUTHWEST, 3 FEMALE SAFF SCOTERS WERE ON THE NORTH IPL SETTLING POND SOUTH OF COUNCIL BLUFFS. THIS POND CAN BE SCOTED FROM THE OVERPASS OVER I-29 WHICH IS REACHED FROM THE EAST SIDE OF THE INTERSTATE OFF OF COUNCIL ROAD L31. THERE WERE ALSO 12 COMMON LOONS ON LAKE MANAWA

For the second time in a week and a half, a bird that has been seen only twice before in the state has been reported. In the south central, Jim Sinclair discovered a female VERMILLION FLYCATCHER at Lake Rathbun in Appanoose County the morning of the 25th, and it stayed in the same location throughout the day. To look for this bird, leave county road J5T just south of the dam and turn into the Island View Park. When you come to a barricade, turn right and go to the end of Dedication Point where the bird was seen around the pavilion and in the larger trees around the point. Also in the area are quite a few late shorebirds, including BLACK BELLIED PLOVER, <sup>and</sup> DUNLIN, as well as FRANKLIN'S and BONAPARTE'S GULLS,

In the northwest, the LEWIS' WOODPECKER has not been seen now since the 18th.

In the northeast, a female BLACK SCOTER was present both the 24th and 25th at Pleasant Creek Lake State Park north of Palo in Linn County. The bird was usually in the middle of the lake, either with a RUDDY DUCK or LESSER SCAUP. There were also two HORNED GREBES and BONAPARTE'S GULLS there on the 25th. Just east of Mohawk Park in Cedar Rapids, six sparrow species including HARRIS', were found on the 25th.

In the central at the Saylorville Reservoir in Polk County, a first year THAYER'S GULL was seen in the area of the dam on the 23rd, and there were also four other gull species.

In the southeast at the Coralville Reservoir in Johnson County, six shorebird species plus AMERICAN PIPITS were just south of county road F-20, two miles west of hiway 965, on the 25th. Jim Fuller (319)338-3561
