Most of the good birds this week are water-related, which is appropriate considering the entire state is now a lake.

In the southwest, where most of the Missouri River plain, along with the roads, are under water, four PIPING PLOVERS and two LEAST TERNS were found at the south IPL pond, south of Council Bluffs on the 25th. In Fremont County, two additional PIPING PLOVERS were in the middle of county road L-31 south of Percival just before that road ends in flood waters. A LITTLE BLUE HERON was with GREAT BLUES and GREAT EGRETS along the west side of L-31 south of Bartlett. Nine shorebird species, including SHORT-BILLED DOWITCHERS were seen in Fremont County, and a LEAST BITTERN was along the south road at Forney Lake. Other birds of note were BLUE GROSBEAKS and WESTERN KINGBIRDS, especially easy to find north of Forney Lake and south of Bartlett, GREAT-TAILED GRACKLES, BELL'S VIREOS. ORCHARD ORIOLES, LOGGERHEAD SHRIKES, and BLACK and FORSTER'S TERNS, while there are hundreds of CATTLE EGRETS in the area.

In the central in Tama County on the 23rd, three SANDHILL CRANES, including a young bird, were at Otter Creek Marsh, south of county road E-66 near its intersection with R Street. A LEAST BITTERN was along the road along the east side of the marsh.

In the north-central in Cerro Gordo County, two LEAST BITTERNS, two VIRGINIA RAILS, and a BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERON were close to the road on its north side at Zirbel Slough on the 23rd and 24th. An AMERICAN BITTERN was at Elm Lake in Wright County on the 23rd.

STOPS. A FEW WERE STOPS ALONG THE ROAD ALONG THE EAST SIDE OF COUNTY ROAD 1-22 NEAR THE INTERSECTION WITH K STREET, INCLUDING A LONELY RIVER, WERE AT OTHER CREEK WATERS IN THE COUNTY IN THE COUNTY ON THE 23RD, THREE SWAMPY

WATERS OF CALLE ECKELS IN THE AREA.

STOPS AND BLACK AND BROWN, 2 WERE, WHITE WERE THE SWAMPY, BERT, 2 ALBERTA, OSCHUBER OKTOBER, TOSSEKNEAD NORTH OF FORTNEY PARK AND SOUTH OF BELLEFAY, CHEVAL-BLISHED CROSSBARKS AND WASHINGTON KINGDOMS, ESPECIALLY AWAY TO THE SOUTH ROAD AT FORTNEY PARK. OTHER RIVERS OF WERE WERE STOPS IN WASHINGTON COUNTY, AND A FEW WERE STOPS ALONG THE PROTECTED AREAS, INCLUDING SHORT-BILLED TOMITCHEMS WERE STOPS ALONG THE WEST SIDE OF 1-21 SOUTH OF BELLEFAY. THE WERE. A FEW WERE STOPS NEARBY AND WITH CHEVAL BROWN AND CHEVAL 1-21 SOUTH OF BELLEFAY THAT BEFORE THE ROAD ENDS IN THE ADDITIONAL BIRDS WERE IN THE MIDDLE OF COUNTY ROAD OF COUNTY BIRDS ON THE 23RD. IN WASHINGTON COUNTY, TWO AND TWO FEW WERE STOPS AT THE SOUTH THE ROAD, STOPS ALONG WITH THE ROAD, AND UNDER WATER, LONG BIRDS WERE IN THE SWAMPY, WERE MOST OF THE WASHINGTON BIRD BIRDS.
