② IN REPORT RECEIVED THE 15TH, IN LINN COUNTY AT PINEY CREEK STATE RECREATION AREA NORTH OF PALO, 3 AMERICAN ADAMELS WERE ON THE BEACH, AND THERE WERE COMMON FORSTER'S, AND BLACK TERNS. A MALLIN WAS SEEN ALONG THE DUBUQUE WATERFRONT ON THE 13TH AND AT BACKBOONE STATE PARK IN DODGEWADE COUNTY, A BLACK THROATED BLUE WARBLER AND OLIVE-SIDED FLYCATCHER WERE SEEN ON THE 13TH. AND IN MUSCATINE COUNTY, A CAPE MAY WARBLER WAS NEAR THE CAMPGROUND AT WILDCAT DEN STATE PARK ON THE 15TH.

At the fall IOU meeting held this past weekend in extreme northeast Iowa, the field trips in Allamakee County produced 131 species with a male BLACK-THROATED BLUE WARBLER near the fire tower at Yellow River State Forest both mornings, a CAPE MAY WARBLER, WHITE PELICANS on the Mississippi near New Albin, and good numbers of raptors, especially OSPREYS and ACCIPITERS.

In the southeast in Des Moines County, at Casey-Barrow Public Landing on the Mississippi River ten miles north of Burlington, KING RAILS, CASPIAN and BLACK TERNS, and a MERLIN were seen on the 13th. At Starr's Cave Preserve on the northwest edge of Burlington, there were ten warbler species and three vireo species, including PINE and BLACK-THROATED GREEN WARBLERS on the 13th. At Hickory Hill Park in Iowa City on the 11th and 12th, nine warbler species, including MOURNING, five vireo species, and SCARLET TANAGER and SWAINSON'S THRUSH were observed.

Upcoming IOU field trips include one led by Bob Myers to Snake Creek Marsh in Greene County on Saturday, September 26th to look for yellow rail, and LeConte's and Sharp-Tailed Sparrows. Meet at 7AM in the parking lot of the Super 8 Motel along hiway 141 in Perry. On November 7th, there will be a trip to Red Rock Reservoir in Marion County, and further details will be forthcoming.
