The week's best bird is a CALIFORNIA GULL in Pottawattamie County. Other sightings included RED CROSSBILL, OLDSQUAW, and SCOTERS.

In the southwest in Pottawattamie County, a winter adult CALIFORNIA GULL was reported from Carter Lake on the 21rst by Tanya Bray. The bird was seen in both Nebraska and Iowa at the southeast end of the lake just north of the wooden bridge which goes over the island off of Abbott Drive. For more information, call Tanya Bray at (402)291-0482. Elsewhere in Pottawattamie County, a female OLDSQUAW was along the west side of Lake Manawa on the 21rst.

In the central in Story County, at least eight RED CROSSBILLS were in Hickory Grove Park, which is 2 miles west and 3 miles south of Colo, on the 20th. The birds were in a line of conifers along the south side of the park. For more information, call Hank Zalatel at (515)377-2889. In Polk County at Dale Moffitt Reservoir southwest of Des Moines, an OLDSQUAW and a HORNED GREBE were found on the 21rst. In Jasper County, a female BLACK SCOTER and a NORTHERN SHRIKE were at Rock Creek Lake State Park on the 20th. In Marshall County, a SNOWY OWL was sitting on a utility pole along county road E-69 between Laurel and Gilman, specifically between Underwood and Vance Avenues on the 15th.

In the west in Harrison County, a TUNDRA SWAN was along I-29 near the rest area about two miles north of Missouri Valley on the 21rst. At DeSoto NWR, the SNOW GOOSE population over the past weekend was estimated at over 400,000, and in the inner courtyard at the visitor center there were several YELLOW-RUMPED WARBLERS and a very late AMERICAN REDSTART.

In the northeast in Allamakee County, 4 GOLDEN EAGLES were observed, two immatures and an adult over the Upper Iowa River bluffs along county road A-26 southwest of New Albin, and an adult near Harper's Ferry, on the 20th. A WHITE-WINGED SCOTER was on pool #9 of the Mississippi River above the dam at Harper's Ferry, but the TUNDRA SWANS normally found in that area were not present. Instead, there were large numbers on the Wisconsin side across the river from the power plant which is south of Lansing. There were a half dozen swans along the Iowa shore in that area. In Linn County, the two female BLACK SCOTERS were still being seen on the 21rst at Pleasant Creek Lake State Recreation Area north of Palo.

In the south-central in Appanoose County, the last report of the SNOWY OWL at Lake Rathbun was from the campground in the Island View Recreation Area south of the dam on the 19th. A WHITE-WINGED SCOTER was on a pond near Lake Rathbun on the 19th. To look for the scoter, take county road J-29 west from hiway 5 a half mile, and then go south on gravel a half mile and the pond is on the left. In Marion County, highlights of the IOU field trip to the Red Rock Reservoir area on the 20th included AMERICAN PIPITS and a late PECTORAL SANDPIPER at the north end of Roberts Creek Lake, and BLACK DUCK, LOGGERHEAD SHRIKE, and ROUGH-LEGGED HAWK.
