The best birds this week were both from the central part of the state; YELLOW RAIL in Greene County, and RED CROSSBILLS in Dallas County.

With the rain falling, twenty-five intrepid birders on the IOU field trip to Snake Creek Marsh in Greene County on the 26th, surrounded and flushed a YELLOW RAIL. For many, it was a life bird. There were also SHARP-TAILED and LECONTE'S SPARROWS, numerous MARSH and SEDGE WRENS, and a NORTHERN HARRIER. This location is reached by going north from Rippey on county road P-46 for 2 miles, and then east on gravel 3/4 mile to a parking lot on the north side of the road. On the 27th, Pam and Reid Allen found two immature RED CROSSBILLS near Granger in Dallas County at the Beaver Catholic Cemetery, which is just south of the intersection of county roads R-22 and F-31. Elsewhere in the central at the Saylorville Reservoir in Polk County, five BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERONS were seen at the pond near the entrance to the parking lot of Sandpiper Recreation Area, and a PEREGRINE FALCON was at the Sandpiper beach, both on the 27th, while on the 24th, eight SANDERLINGS and a BLACK-BELLIED PLOVER were at the beach there. At the Oak Grove beach, there were eight SANDERLINGS and two BAIRD'S SANDPIPERS on the 27th. At Grammer Grove Park in Marshall County, there was a YELLOW-BELLIED SAPSUCKER on the 23rd, and on the 27th, 285 hawks were counted, with 75 BROAD-WINGS, 88 SHARP-SHINNED, and 45 COOPER'S.
