There were also YELLOW-BREASTED CHAT, WHITE-EYED VIREO, and BLUE-WINGED WARBLER in the same area. Along the Des Moines River Road between the state forest and the village of Croton, two BLUE GROSBEAKS were seen near a mailbox with the name Gary and Judy Palmer. In Van Buren County near Lacey-Keosauqua State Park, HENSLOW'S SPARROWS were still singing on the 24th. For more information on any of these birds, leave your name and phone number after the report.
