IN NEWS RECEIVED THE 28TH IN THE NORTH
CENTRAL IN NORTH AND WINNEBAGO COUNTIES,
AN EARLY GEESE AND VIRGINIA RAIL WERE ON THE
NORTH SIDE OF SILVER LAKE AND 2 WESTERN
GEESES WERE AT RICE LAKE ON THE 27TH. IN
CENTRO GORDON COUNTY, THE SWAINSON'S HAWK NEST
EAST OF MASON CITY IS STILL ACTIVE. GO SOUTH
FROM HIGHWAY 18
ON THE FIRST ROAD WEST OF THE WINNEBAGO RIVER
AND THE NEST IS IN A COTTONWOOD TREE ABOUT 200
YARDS NORTH OF THE WATER TREATMENT PLANT.

IN THE CENTRAL, THE WESTERN KINGBIRD NEST ON
THE STATE CAPITOL GROUNDS IN DEL MONTE WAS
STILL ACTIVE, ^{BY THE 27TH} AND IS LOCATED IN THE MIDDLE OF 3
SECAMORE TREES AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE
CAPITOL BUILDING.

It's not too early to start looking for southbound migrant shorebirds, as evidenced by a weekend report from the Ames area. The best birds are PRARIE WARBLER and HENSLOW'S SPARROW in the southeast, and WESTERN GREBE in Worth County.

In the southeast at the Croton Unit of Shimek State Forest in Lee County, a pair of PRARIE WARBLERS was present on the 24th along the west side of the large open area on top of the hill. There were also YELLOW-BREASTED CHAT, WHITE-EYED VIREO, and BLUE-WINGED WARBLER in the same area. Along the Des Moines River Road between the state forest and the village of Croton, two BLUE GROSBEAKS were seen near a mailbox with the name Gary and Judy Palmer. In Van Buren County near Lacey-Keosauqua State Park, HENSLOW'S SPARROWS were still singing on the 24th. For more information on any of these birds, leave your name and phone number after the report. In Johnson County, at the MacBride Nature and Recreation Area, LOUISIANA WATERTHRUSH, and PROTHONOTARY and CERULEAN WARBLERS were seen from the trail that runs along the south side of Lake MacBride on the 27th, and a YELLOW-THROATED WARBLER was singing in sycamore trees near the parking lot for the swim beach at Lake MacBride State Park on the 27th.

In the north-central in Worth County on the 23rd, two WESTERN GREBES, seven EARED GREBES, REDHEADS, COMMON MOORHENS, and BLACK TERNS were at Silver Lake, which is west of I-35, just south of the Minnesota border.

In the central in Story County, LEAST and STILT SANDPIPERS were in a flooded field east of Ames on the 26th. Go east from the 13th Street exit of I-35 for a mile to where the pavement ends, and then south a hundred yards. In northern Madison County, NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRDS are nesting. In the southwest, 89 CATTLE EGRETS were seen on the 23rd in Fremont and Pottawattamie Counties, with 65 at one location near the east end of the old hiway 2 bridge over the Missouri River east of Nebraska City. There were also GREAT-TAILED GRACKLES and CASPIAN TERNS there. The other CATTLE EGRETS were at Forney Lake and the south IPL pond.

In the northeast in Jones County near Stone City, Chris Edwards reported KENTUCKY, HOODED, and CERULEAN WARBLERS, ACADIAN FLYCATCHER, LOUISIANA WATERTHRUSH, and VEERY. For more information, call Chris at (319)626-6362.
