The return of winter halted much additional waterfowl migration this past week. The best birds are TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRE and TRUMPETER SWAN.

In the north-central, the two TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRES were still in the Shell Rock River greenbelt in Cerro Gordo County as of the 14th. To look for these birds go south from Rock Falls on county road S-62 for one mile, and then east on 295th Street for a mile and a half. Park just west of a cement bridge and walk south 200-250 yards. For updates, call Kurt Nelson at (515)696-5600.

In the south-central in Marion County, three TRUMPETER SWANS were at the Red Rock Reservoir. Two swans with yellow neck bands were below the dam in the inlet on the north side on the 12th, and a single bird with a wing tag was at the north end and east side of the mile long bridge which carries hiway 14 over the reservoir. on the 9th.

In the southeast, a field trip that included Cone Marsh in Louisa County and Cedar Lake in Cedar Rapids on the 13th produced 13 duck species. At Cone Marsh, there were fifty WHITE-FRONTED GEESE, COMMON SNIPE, and AMERICAN WOODCOCK. On the 14th, a NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD was at the waterer of Jim Walters, who lives in Johnson County on the south side of hiway 1 about nine miles southwest of Iowa City.
