

(3) IN NEWS FROM THE 8TH IN BLACKHAWK COUNTY, A NORTHERN SAW-WHET OWL WAS FOUND AT GEORGE WYTH STATE PARK JUST NORTH OF WATERLOO. THE BIRD WAS IN THE WEST END OF THE PARK ABOUT 50 FEET SOUTHWEST OF THE LODGE. NUMEROUS HORNEED LARKS AND LAPLAND LONGSPURS WERE SEEN ^{ON GRAVEL ROADS} BETWEEN HIGHWAYS 21 AND 63 FROM 2 TO 6 MILES SOUTH OF WATERLOO.

(2) IN NEWS FROM THE 9TH, ^{IN MARION} A TRUMPETER SWAN WAS AT THE NORTH END AND EAST SIDE OF THE MILE LONG BRIDGE WHICH CARRIES HIGHWAY 14 OVER THE RED ROCK RESERVOIR. IN THE SOUTHWEST, THE ONLY OPEN WATER IS THE IPL POND SOUTH OF COUNCIL BLUFFS, WHERE ON THE 7TH THERE WERE HOODED MERRINGERS, GREATER SCAUP AND OTHER DIVING DUCKS AND A PRARIE FALCON WAS A FLYOVER.

The first week of March and waterfowl have begun to trickle back into the south, BALD EAGLES are beginning to move out, and KILLDEER and RED-WINGED BLACKBIRDS were widely reported as new arrivals. The best birds are OLDSQUAW and TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRE.

In the south-central in Marion County, the OLDSQUAW which spent much of the winter just below the Red Rock Reservoir dam, evidently, has moved downstream about three miles in the area of the old Dollar Bridge, where it was seen on the 6th.

Tim Schantz reported a COMMON REDPOLL at his feeder at the Cordova Park ranger's house on the 5th, but apparently it has not returned. He also had a MERLIN as a flyby on the 4th.

In the north-central, the two TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRES continue in the Shell Rock River greenbelt in Cerro Gordo County as of the 6th. To look for these birds, from Rock Falls go south on county road S-62 for a mile, and then east on 295th Street for a mile and a half. Park just west of a cement bridge and walk south 200-250 yards. There were also an estimated 500 CEDAR WAXWINGS in that area. For updates, call Kurt Nelson at (515(696)-5600.

In the northeast in Allamakee County on the 6th, three GOLDEN EAGLES were still at their usual wintering location along county road A-26 southwest of New Albin, a NORTHERN SHRIKE was along hiway 76 at the top of the hill west of Effigy Mounds, and a BREWER'S BLACKBIRD was by a feeder at the west edge of Lansing. In Bremer County, a NORTHERN SAW-WHET OWL was in a pine grove in the south part of Hayes Access, which is two miles south and three miles east of Tripoli on the 2nd.

In the southeast in Iowa County, a NORTHERN SAW-WHET OWL was at the Amana Woods in the old ice pond area, which is on the north side of hiway 6, a half mile west of Homestead on the 6th. In Johnson County, a NORTHERN HARRIER was just south of the intersection of Swan Lake and Greencastle Roads on the 7th, and a HERMIT THRUSH was at the south end of Lexington Street in Iowa City on the 3rd.
