It must be the winter doldrums, as few reports were recieved this past week. There is an interesting exotic in the southeast, two CHINESE THRUSHES (WAH-MEE) that have been seen daily in an Ottumwa backyard for several months now. If interested in seeing these birds, call Darleen Ayres at (515)682-1697.

Elsewhere in the southeast in Scott County along the Mississippi River, an adult GLAUCOUS GULL was above the I-74 bridge sitting on the rocks in the middle of the river, as seen from the Butterworth Parkway in Moline, and a first-year ICELAND GULL was spotted near the entrance to Credit Island Park in Davenport, both on the 14th. In Iowa County, an Iowa City Bird Club outing to the Amana Wood located four NORTHERN SAW-WHET OWLS in the old ice pond area, which is on the north side of hiway #6 a half mile west of Homestead. In Johnson County at the Coralville Reservoir, a LONG-EARED OWL was in a row of scotch pines about a quarter mile southwest of the intersection of the Greencastle and Swan Lake Roads on the 13th.

In the west in Harrison County, Nina and Wayne Strang reported a male GREAT-TAILED GRACKLE in their yard in Modale on the 11th.

In the northeast in Delaware County, a HERMIT THRUSH was in a pine planting at Backbone State Park, 200 yards south of the north entrance on the 7th. In Linn County at Cedar Lake in Cedar Rapids, in with the hundreds of MALLARDS and CANADA GEESE on the 14th were WOOD DUCKS, REDHEAD, BLACK DUCKS, *LESSER SCAUP* AMERICAN COOT, RING-NECKED DUCKS, HOODED MERGANSERS, and DOUBLE-CRESTED CORMORANT, *PIED-BILLED GREBE.*
