The best place in the state to see GOLDEN EAGLES is in Allamakee County, where the birds winter roost is just north of there in Minnesota. The eagles are most often seen over the Upper Iowa River bluffs, and a consistently good location is along county road A-36 southwest of New Albin. An adult was seen there on the 5th. The week's highlights are PRARIE FALCON, TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRE, and ICELAND GULL.

In the northwest, a PRARIE FALCON was seen on the 7th in Buena Vista County along county road M-31, a mile north of its intersection with C-65. In Ida County, two NORTHERN SAW-WHET OWLS were at Moorhead Park on the 5th; one was in pines across from the depot, and the other was across the lake from the restroom facility.

In the north-central, the two TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRES and four YELLOW-RUMPED WARBLERS were still being found in Cerro Gordo County on the 5th. From Rock Falls, go south on county road S-62 for a mile and a half, and then east on 290th Street for 1.6 miles. Walk north along the snowmobile trail and look north of the old iron bridge. For updates, call Kurt Nelson at (515)696-5600.

In the southeast in Scott County along the Mississippi River, a second-winter ICELAND GULL was seen in Davenport near the Centennial Bridge downstream from Lock & Dam #15 on the 7th, and a first-year GLAUCOUS GULL was at Lock & Dam #14 on the 2nd. In Johnson County, an immature GOLDEN EAGLE was in the Big Bend area of the Coralville Reservoir on the 2nd.

In the south-central in Appanoose County in the Prarie Ridge Area on the north side of Lake Rathbun, a snowmobile trail begins 0.3 miles west of the Prarie Ridge Bait Shop, and on the 7th about 15 YELLOW-RUMPED WARBLERS and GOLDEN-CROWNED KINGLETS, plus a SHORT-EARED OWL were seen while walking that trail toward the lake. A RED-SHOULDERED HAWK was along county road J3T a mile northwest of Unionville on the 7th.

In the central in Polk County, at Big Creek State Park, at various times last week SHORT-EARED, LONG-EARED, and NORTHERN SAW-WHET OWLS were found in cedar trees north of the end of 100th Street. A WINTER WREN was along the Des Moines River north of the Sycamore Access between shelterhouses #8 and #9 on the 5th. At Crown Point Lake in Johnston, the waterfowl on the 7th included GREATER SCAUP, RING-NECKED DUCKS, SHOVELERS, AMERICAN WIGEON, SNOW GEESE, and BLACK DUCKS. A RED-BREASTED NUTHATCH was still being found in the pine grove at the west edge of Jester Park on the 3rd. In Boone County, a NORTHERN GOSHAWK was observed in the public hunting area just north of the Ledges State Park on the 7th.
