Along the state's eastern border, the Mississippi River is a magnet for waterfowl, gulls, and bald eagles. At this time there are thousands of gulls and numerous diving ducks from Keokuk to above Davenport. Excellent viewing spots include Lock and Dam #14 and 15, above and in Davenport, Lock and Dam #19 at Keokuk, pool #19 in the Montrose area, the Fort Madison waterfront, and pool #14 in the LeClaire area. The highlights remain the same for the third straight week, ICELAND GULL, TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRE, OLDSQUAW, and TRUMPETER SWAN.

In the southeast in Scott County at Lock and Dam #14 on the Mississippi, first year gulls of all three white-winged species, ICELAND, GLAUCOUS, and THAYER'S were found on the 31rst. In addition, an adult ICELAND of the KUMLIEN'S variety was present. An adult ICELAND has not been reported in the state previously. Lock and Dam #14 is reached from hiway #67, two miles south of I-80. In Johnson County, a first year ICELAND GULL was on the Iowa River at Iowa City near the Hancher Auditorium on the 30th. At the Coralville Reservoir, a LONG-EARED OWL and a NORTHERN SHRIKE were found a quarter mile southwest of the intersection of the Swan Lake and Greencastle Roads on the 30th, and the owl was still there on the 31rst, and the NORTHERN SAW-WHET OWL was still present in cedar trees along the north side of county road F-20, 0.7 miles west of the Hawkeye Wildlife Area headquarters on the 30th. In Lee County, a first year GLAUCOUS GULL was seen along the Fort Madison waterfront near the Amtrak Station on the 27th.

In the north-central, the two TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRES and four YELLOW-RUMPED WARBLERS were still being seen in Cerro Gordo County on the 31rst. Kurt Nelson gives some different diections to find the birds which seem to have moved farther south. From Rock Falls, go south for a mile and a half on county road S-62, and then east on 290th Street for 1.6 miles. Walk north along th snowmobile trail, and look in the vicinity of the old iron bridge. You can call Kurt for updates at (515)696-5600.

In the south-central in Marion County, the OLDSQUAW was still below the Red Rock Reservoir dam between the footbridge and the old iron bridge on the 29th.

In the northeast in Linn County, the two TRUMPETER SWANS were still on the Cedar River near the roller dam along Old River Road in the south part of Cedar Rapids on the 30th, and the adult NORTHERN GOSHAWK was in pines at the west edge of the Cedar Rapids Nursery, 2100 Wilson Avenue on the 30th.
