In news from the 31st in **Southwest Iowa**: A Snowy Egret was seen one mile north of the intersection of L-31 and Hiway 2. East of the Glenwood Exit of I-29 were 20 Cattle Egrets. At the IPL ponds: one Piping Plover at the south pond, and 3 Blue Grosbeaks at the last turn on the road to the north pond.

In the **Southeast** on the 31st: a Western Kingbird one mile west of the Turkey Run Access in a yard by the Schmidt mailbox.

In the **Northwest** on the 31st: Two Western Grebes at the Five-Island Lake N. of Emmetsburg; a pair of Northern Harriers, believed to be nesting, at Anderson Prairie N. of Esterville, and Cattle Egrets along the flooded Des Moines River along Hiway 4 N of Graettinger near the southern border of Emmet county.
