Anyone experiencing midsummer doldrums should visit the Capitol grounds in Des Moines. During this past week on Wednesday, Amy Offenburger and I observed four WESTERN KINGBIRDS fledging from one nest in about 15 minutes. This nest is directly south of the Capitol in the second Sycamore on the east side of the sidewalk and about 25 feet up in the tree on the east side of the tree.

Also in this tree is a CEDAR WAXWING nest.

There was another WESTERN KINGBIRD nest in the SE corner of the Capitol grounds, but it appears only one kingbird fledged successfully from that nest. This nest is about 20 feet high and is also on the east side of the tree.

I suspect there are more nests on the grounds. An adult WESTERN KINGBIRD chased off a KESTREL, which added a little action to the visit.
