<u>Details</u>: Contopus, Empid, or Sayornis flycatcher with no eyering seen and buffy wingbars (size difficult in isolation). Singing continuously, akin to Eastern Phoebe but both notes burry, more separated, with clearly accented up-note for second note. Trailing third note often mentioned in field guides and recordings not heard.

<u>Details</u>: SeWr was spotted with dried grass blade in bill; carried it from perch to perch, then disappeared with blade into the grass less than ten yards before me. After it flew out again, minus the grass blade, I investigated and found that a clump of the living green grass blades had been bent over at their tops and woven into a loose canopy. The grasses seemed to be integrated with a fallen, dried, forked thistle stem and had a sparse cluster of dried grasses inside, as if the interior of the nest was just being started. Area was well-removed from 1 June SeWr seen with nesting material (above).

<u>Details</u> (as to possible juvenile): First heard singing in a usual location at site; brief middle passing syllable inserted into familiar *tsi-lick* song, timbre clearly of Henslow's, and something very close to this is recorded on Stokes CD. Bird seen frontally only, perched for several minutes, but more distant than is ideal for binoculars, with sun to side and slightly behind bird (about 2:45 p.m., looking west-northwest). Flat-headed sparrow; briefly glimpsed dark crown and light median stripe as head moved. Purely white or very light gray breast (this aspect well-seen), no streaking visible, but no buff noted either. At closest distance attained, slight impression of olive to head at one angle. Song impossible to reconcile with Grasshopper or Savannah Sparrow, volume nearly comparable to Dickcissel.
