AT IOWA, OCT<sup>4</sup>, A RED BREASTED NUTHATCHED WAS  
PRESENT AT A FEEDER ON WED OCT 5.

THREE PELAGIC BIRDS THAT EITHER NEVER BEFORE OR RARELY FIND THEIR WAY TO IOWA HIGHLIGHT THIS WEEK'S REPORT.

FIRST, THE MAGNIFICENT FRIGATEBIRD FIRST DISCOVERED AT CLEAR LAKE ON SEPT. 24, WAS NOT SEEN SINCE THURSDAY SEPT. 29. HOWEVER, SHORTLY AFTER NOON ON SUNDAY OCT 2 A FRIGATEBIRD WAS SIGHTED AT THE VISITOR'S CENTER AT RED ROCK RESERVOIR IN MARION COUNTY IN S. CENTRAL IOWA. IT IS INTERESTING THAT FRIGATEBIRDS HAVE BEEN REPORTED IN THE PAST WEEK AS FOLLOWS: 2 ON LAKE MICHIGAN NEAR CHICAGO, LAKE ITASCA IN MINNESOTA, MICHIGAN, OHIO, KANSAS CITY AREA, AND ONTARIO. HURRICANE GILBERT PACKED QUITE A WILLOW IN FRIGATEBIRDS.

SECOND, THE JAEGERS; ON WEDNESDAY SEPT 28, 3 JAEGERS, A PARASITIC AND 2 POMARINES WERE DISCOVERED AT SAWYORVILLE RESERVOIR NORTH OF DES MOINES IN POLK COUNTY. THE 2 POMARINES WERE STILL PRESENT AS OF SUNDAY AFTERNOON OCT 2. ALTHOUGH THEY CAN OFTEN BE SEEN FROM SHORE FLYING OR SITTING ON THE WATER, THE BEST VIEWS ARE

GAINED BY GOING OUT ON THE LAKE IN A BOAT, SINCE AT LEAST ONE BIRD CAN BE APPROACHED CLOSELY BY SLOWLY MOTIONING UP TO IT. A BOAT CAN BE RENTED FROM THE SAYLORVILLE MARINA.

THE THIRD GOOD BIRD IS A RED PHALAROPE, FIRST SEEN SEPT 30, AND STILL PRESENT SUNDAY AFTERNOON OCT 2 JUST NORTH OF THE NIWAS 17 BRIDGE AT THE NORTH END OF SAYLORVILLE<sup>PARK</sup>. IT IS A BIRD MOLTING INTO FIRST WINTER PLUMAGE AND HAS BEEN SEEN WITH A LARGE GROUP OF SHOREBIRDS.

IN OTHER REPORTS, IN NORTH CENTRAL IOWA AT UNTURA MARSH AT THE WEST END OF CLEAR LAKE IN CERRO GORDO COUNTY ON SEPT 28, THERE WERE 100 WHITE PELICANS, 10 COMMON EGRETS, A PEGREGINE FALCON AND NUMEROUS FRANKLIN'S GULLS.
