

IF YOU FIND SICK BIRDS, YOU SHOULD HANDLE THEM WITH GLOVES, PLACE IN A PAPER BAG OR CARDBOARD BOX AND CONTACT DR. PEELER IN THE DIAGNOSTIC LAB AT IOWA STATE UNIV. THE WEEK'S BEST BIRD WAS AN IBIS SPECIES SEEN ON AUGUST 18 AT UNION RAVINE NWR, KOSIUTH CO. IT WAS OBSERVED IN THE POOL TO THE NORTH OF THE SOUTH ROAD.

BIRDS SEEN AUGUST 18 INCLUDED, LITTLE BLUE HERON, SNOWY EGRET, + AVOCETS. OTHER GOOD BIRDS SEEN THIS PAST WEEK INCLUDED MEXICAN GODWIT, YELLOW CROWNED NIGHT HERON, 3 SPECIES OF TEALS.

ALSO IN SE IOWA, AT FAIRFIELD HOUSE FINCHES WERE REPORTED AND SINGING BELL'S VIREOS WERE STILL PRESENT AT JEFFERSON CO PARK JUST W. OF FAIRFIELD LOOK FOR THE VIREOS IN THE FIELD & ALONG THE POOLS N. OF THE CAMPING AREA
