IN NE IOWA, A SHORELARK + 3 LONG EARED  
OWLS AT MARK SAND PRAIRIE IN NW BLACK-  
HAWK CO ON THE 22<sup>ND</sup>. AND JUST N OF  
CEDAR RAPIDS A S EARED OWL FLYING AT  
DUSK ON THE 25<sup>TH</sup>.

IN SE IOWA AT THE CORAUVILLE RES IN  
JOHNSON CO. ON THE 29<sup>TH</sup> - 2 <sup>A FEMALE SURF SCOTER AND ON</sup> CORMORANTS, 2 <sup>THE</sup> 27<sup>TH</sup>  
BALD EAGLES, 5 BONAPARTE'S Gulls, AND A  
COMMON LOON AND AT LAKE MALCORDE, NODDIA  
MERGANSERS AND A NORNED GRACE. WHILE AT  
~~THE~~ IOWA CITY'S NICKERBOURNE HILL PARK A  
SAW WNET OWL ON THE 27<sup>TH</sup>.

AS LONG AS THE LAKES AND PONDS REMAIN UNFROZEN,  
GOOD WATER ASSOCIATED BIRDS CONTINUE TO BE REPORTED.  
ON FRIDAY, NOV. 25, A FIRST WINTER BLACK-LEGGED  
KITTIWAKE WAS DISCOVERED AT THE TAILWATER AREA BELOW  
THE RED ROCK DAM IN MARION COUNTY. IT WAS SEEN  
FLYING AND SITTING WITH RING BILLED GULLS, AND IT  
WAS STILL PRESENT ON SUNDAY THE 27<sup>TH</sup>. AT RED  
ROCK LAKE THERE ARE ABOUT 2000 WATERFOWL, MOSTLY  
MALLARDS AND AT RATHBUN RESERVOIR IN APPANOOSE  
COUNTY 250 CANADA GEESE AND A FEW DUCKS.

AT SAYLORVILLE RESERVOIR IN POLK COUNTY, SEVERAL  
GOOD BIRDS CONTINUE TO BE SEEN. THE ROCK  
LOXEN AT THE CHERRY GLEN ACCESS FIRST LOCATED  
ON THE 8<sup>TH</sup> WAS STILL BEING SEEN ON THE 26<sup>TH</sup>.  
LOOK IN THE ROCKS BETWEEN THE BOAT LAUNCHES.  
<sup>LAST WEEK'S</sup> ~~THE~~ LESSER BLACK BACKED GULL WAS SEEN NEAR  
THE BIG CREEK SPILLWAY ON THE 21<sup>ST</sup> AND FROM  
THE HIWAY #17 BRIDGE ON THE 23<sup>RD</sup>. AND THE  
3-4 OLDSQUAWS EAST OF THE HIWAY #17 BRIDGE  
WERE STILL PRESENT ON THE 26<sup>TH</sup>. IN OTHER  
REPORTS FROM SAYLORVILLE-BIG CREEK, 2 SANDHILL  
CRANES WERE SEEN FLYING OVER CHERRY GLEN  
ON THE 26<sup>TH</sup>, A FRANKLIN'S GULL IN FULL  
BREEDING PLUMAGE, AND A LATE GREAT BLUE HERON  
WERE EAST OF THE HIWAY 17 BRIDGE ON THE 23<sup>RD</sup>  
ALSO 3 COMMON LOONS ON SAYLORVILLE LAKE AND  
A LATE LESSER YELLOWLEGS AT BIG CREEK WILDLIFE
