LAST WEEK'S REPORT FEATURED AN IBIS, AND THIS PAST WEEK AN AMAZING NUMBER OF 6 IBISES WERE SEEN AT FORNEY LAKE. ALTHOUGH BOTH GLOSSY AND WHITE-FACED IBIS HAVE BEEN REPORTED IN IOWA, THE WHITE FACED WOULD BE MORE LIKELY. IN THE SPRING, THE TWO SPECIES CAN BE SEPARATED UNDER GOOD VIEWING CONDITIONS, BUT IN THE FALL, IT IS DIFFICULT EXCEPT UNDER OPTIMAL VIEWING CONDITIONS. THUS MOST FALL IBISES AS REPORTED AS IBIS SPECIES.

FОРNEY'S LAKE IN FREEMONT CO IN EXTREME SW IOWA WAS THE PLACE TO BE FOR BOTH BIRDS AND BIRDS. ON AUGUST 26TH, IN ADDITION TO THE 6 IBISES, THERE WERE 162 GREAT BLUE HERONS, 58 GREAT EGRETS, 14 SNOWY EGRETS, 3 AVOCETS, 2 BALD EAGLES, RING BILLED & FRANKLIN'S CORMS AND MANY SHOREBIRDS.
