1 A RED SHOULDERED HAWK ~~WAS~~ WAS SEEN APPROXIMATELY 5 MILES WEST OF UNION IN HARDIN COUNTY IN ~~CENTRAL IOWA~~ IT IS PROBABLY THE SAME BIRD THAT SPENT MOST OF LAST WINTER AT THAT LOCATION NORTH OF COUNTY ROAD D-65.

ALSO IN CENTRAL IOWA AT HENDRICKSON MARSH IN SE STORY COUNTY ON OCTOBER 5, 2 SHARP TAILED AND 1 LECONTE'S SPARROW IN THE KNEE HIGH GRASS ADJACENT TO THE MUD IN THE NW CORNER OF THE MARSH. ALSO 3-5 WATER PIPITS ON THE MUD AND A BLACK CROWNED NIGHT HERON

AT JACOB KRUMM PRESERVE IN EASTERN TASPEN COUNTY A LECONTE'S SPARROW AROUND THE POND ON OCTOBER 7<sup>TH</sup>.

AT GRAMMAR GROVE PARK IN MARSHALL Co. ON OCT 8<sup>TH</sup>, HARRIS + FOX SPARROWS, ORANGE CR WARBLER, YELLOW BELLED SABLECKER + BROWN CREEPER

IN NW IOWA, AN IBIS SPECIES WAS  
OBSERVED ALONG THE SOUTH ROAD AT DAN  
GREENE SLAUGH IN CLAY COUNTY ON OCT. 5TH

AND IN SE IOWA, A RED BREASTED NUTHATCH  
WAS BEEN ~~NOT~~ AT AN IOWA CITY FEEDER SINCE OCT. 5.
