The week's highlights are MACGILLIVRAY'S WARBLER, MISSISSIPPI KITE, and SANDHILL CRANE in the central, PIPING PLOVER, LEAST TERN, SNOWY EGRET, LITTLE BLUE HERON, MARBLED GODWIT, BARN OWL, and GLOSSY and WHITE-FACED IBIS in the southwest, and SANDHILL CRANE in the northeast. The LAZULI BUNTINGS at Spencer stayed two days, and departed on the 29th.

In the central in Hardin County, Mark Proescholdt discovered a male MACGILLIVRAY'S WARBLER at the Eagle Access, <sup>ONE TIME 2200</sup> It was singing and chipping in a tangle along the west side of the road, right wherte the road forks about an eight of a mile in from the entrance. In Polk County, at Least one MISSISSIPPI KITE was still being seen on the 2nd in a cottonwood tree at the rear parking lot at the Olivet Baptist Church at 73rd and Del Matro in Des Moines. You can reach this area from I-235 by taking the 8th Street West Des Moines exit and going north past University Avenue. In Tama County, a SANDHILL CRANE was at Otter Creek Marsh on the 3rd.

In the southwest in Fremont County, there have been a lot of good birds this past week, especially coming in to roost in the evening along the north side of hiway 2 east of Nebraska City. On the 2nd, there were 140 CATTLE EGRETS, 4 adult LITTLE BLUE HERONSD, and 5 GREAT-TAILED GRACKLES there. On the 31rst a SNOWY EGRET was woth 12 CATTLE EGRETS, and on the 29th there were also 5 IBIS, including 3 WHITE-FACED, and at least one GLOSSY. At least 2 CHUCK-WILLS-WIDOWS were at there traditional location in the loess hills, about a mile and a half north of hiway 2 just off of county road L-44 on the 2nd. At Waubonsie State Park on the 3rd, SUMMER TANAGER and LOUISIANA WATERTHRUSH were found, and 2 GREAT-TAILED GRACKLES were at the south end of Forney Lake on the 2nd. In Taylor County, Zelbert Freemyer once again has three nests of BARN OWLS at his place six miles east and a mile south of Bedford. To see these birds, you must make arrangements with Zelbery at (712)523-2680. In Pottawattamie County at the Midwest Power Company's south settling pond, there were 2 LEAST TERNS and 3 PIPING PLOVER on the 2nd, and 8

MARbled GODWITS were spotted there on the 31rst.

In the northeastt in Clinton County, 4 SANDHILL CRANES were seen at Goose Lake, near the town of the same name on the 31rst, while a BROAD-WINGED HAWK was seen at the Wildcat Bluff Area on the 31rst. In Linn County, a CONNECTICUT WARBLER was at Squaw Creek Park on the 2nd. For more information, call Allen Martin at (319)395-0583.

In the west in Monona County, there was a COMMON MOORHEN and 2 EARED GREBES at Blue Lake on the 2nd.
