TODAY, NOV. 15TH TWO MORE GOOD BIRDS WERE DISCOVERED IN THE STATE. AT GLENDALE CEMETERY, LOCATED NEAR 49TH + UNIVERSITY IN DES MOINES, A PINE GROSBEAR WAS FOUND AT THE FIRST INTERSECTION NORTH OF THE OFFICE BLDG.

AND AT THE JESTER PARK AREA OF THE SAVORVILLE RESERVOIR IN POLK COUNTY, AN ADULT LESSER BLACK BACKED GULL WAS SEEN. A GOOD LOCATION TO VIEW THE GULLS THERE IS CAMPING AREA #4 IN JESTER PARK

A RED SHOULDER HAWK WAS OBSERVED ON THE 17TH. AT DESOTO BEND NW IN HARRISON CO ON THE 12TH, A W-W SCOTER + 19 ROSS' GEESE WERE PICKED OUT OF APPROX 100,000 SWANS GEESE

IN SE IOWA IN LEE CO - AT POOL #19 OF THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER 15-20 GREATER SCAUP WERE PICKED OUT FROM THE THOUS OF WATERFOWL PRESENT + ALSO COULD BE COMPARED TO THE MANY LESSER SCAUP. THESE BIRDS WERE OBSERVED ^{ON THE 13TH} FROM THE LINGER-LONGER REST AREA ALONG US #61 N. OF MONTROSE. AND ALONG THE RIVER ROAD BETWEEN MONTROSE + KEOKUK SEVERAL COMMON LOONS

IN NE IOWA, AS MANY AS 1000 TUNDRA SWANS, WERE PRESENT ON POOL #9, ^{IN ALLIANCE TO} N OF HARPERS FERRY. TO SEE THESE BIRDS + A VARIETY OF DUCKS + GEESE EXIT CO. ROAD X-52, APPROX 2 MILES N OF HARPERS FERRY + FOLLOW THE GRAVEL WHICH TURNS INTO DIRT ROAD.
