

THE SOUTHEASTERN TOWN SPOTS WERE BIRDING
EXTENSIVELY THIS PAST WEEK IN LEE AND UNION
COUNTIES, AND THE BROWN'S WRENS WERE
REPORTED AS PRESENT ALMOST EACH DAY INCLUDING
THE JUNE 24TH. THE FOLLOWING IS A TOUR OF THIS
AREA. FROM THE STOP SIGN AT THE VILLAGE OF ANGIE,
GO WEST 1.8 MILES AND THEN RIGHT AT A 'Y' LESS
THAN $\frac{1}{2}$ MILE TO THE FAR END OF A JUNK YARD
WHERE THE BROWN'S WRENS HAVE BEEN SEEN DAILY.
ONE BIRD USED EITHER OF 2 SMALL DEAD ELM TREES
ABOUT 50-75 FEET FROM THE ROAD ON THE WEST
SIDE. ORCHARD ORIOLES ARE PRESENT THERE AS WELL.
A LITTLE FARTHER ALONG THE ROAD LOOK FOR SUMMER
TANAGER NEAR THE ENTERING CRITZIA LIMIT OR SHIMMEL
STATE FOREST SIGN. STILL FARTHER, IN FACT 1.3
MILES FROM THE 'Y' AT THE BOTTOM OF THE HILL JUST
BEFORE A SMALL BRIDGE, LOOK FOR YELLOW BREASTED
CHAT AROUND THE CREEK AND HOODED WARBLER
JUST INTO THE WOODS ON THE RIGHT. FARTHER INTO
THE WOODS, LOOK FOR ^{WHITE EYES & VIREOS,} LOUDWAIR WATERTHrush, ACRODIA
FLYCATCHER, SCARLET AND SUMMER TANAGER,
WORM EATING WARBLERS FEEDING YOUNG, CERULEAN,
KENTUCKY, A ^{BLUE WINGED} AND PARACIA WARBLERS. SEVERAL
MILES FARTHER UP THE RIVER ROAD LOOK FOR
LARK SPARROW, AND .9 MILE POST THE TURNER
RIVER ACCESS LOOK FOR BLUE GROSBEAK NEAR A
MAILBOX WITH THE NAME ROY PALMER, JR.
CONTINUE ON THE RIVER ROAD TO GREENWELL TOW,
THEN HIGHWAY 2 TO HIGHWAY 1 AND GO NORTH

To Lacey Keo Kansas State Park, where at the
Sly Ford and Stone Bridge areas look for
yellow-throated, Cerulean, Kentucky, and Prairie
Warblers, Louisiana Waterthrush, Acadian Fly-
catcher. Then return to Hwy 1 and from
Keo Kansas go west on Van Buren County Road
J-40 for 4.7 miles, then south on gravel
1.3 miles then west and look in the
fields on either side of road that begin
after 1½ miles. Look for New Snow's and
Grasshopper Sparrow, orchard oriole, upland
Sandpiper and Short-eared owl. Follow Hwy
1 to 1½ miles north of Fairfield, turn
east of HO Street by the sign Soil Technology
and look for a Cattle Egret around the
first farmstead. It was present on the 24th.

Still in Southeast Iowa, a Mississippi Kite was
found on the 24th sitting in a dead tree
about a hundred yards north of the
Bloomington Street parking lot of Hickory Hill
Park in Iowa City.

In the Northeast a pileated woodpecker
2½ miles southeast of Anamosa in Jones
County on the 21st. At Cardwell^{MARSH} in Waukesha
County a female goldeneye, 6 redpolls and
a green-winged teal on the 20th. In
Allamakee County along a trail that runs
from Hwy 76 along the south side of the
