UPDATES ON GOOD BIRDS MENTIONED IN THE WEEK'S REPORT  
THE TOWNSPIKE'S SOLITAIRES WERE STILL THERE<sup>ALONG WITH 50 PHAROE FRENCHES</sup> ON THE 8<sup>TH</sup> AND  
THERE MAY BE 3 BIRDS. THE BOHEMIAN WARBLER IN MUS LARRY  
WAS LOOKED FOR ON THE 5<sup>TH</sup> AND NOT FOUND. THE 3 WHITE-WINGED  
CLOUDS ON THE UI CAMPUS WERE STILL THERE TODAY IN THE  
RUINS IN NE MLOCK. JUST SOUTH OF THE BOWER SOCIETY ON  
THE 3 LONG-EARED OWLS AT MORGAN CREEK PARK NEAR  
CEDAR RAPIDS WERE THERE THROUGH THE 8<sup>TH</sup>

OWLS AND THE CONTINUED PRESENCE OF EUROPEAN TREE SPARROWS AND TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRES ARE THE WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS.

IN NORTHWEST IOWA, THE TWO TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRES AT BROWN'S LAKE SOUTH OF SIOUX CITY WERE STILL PRESENT AT LEAST THROUGH JANUARY 5<sup>TH</sup>. FOR DIRECTIONS OR UPDATES, CALL BILL HUSER AT (402) 494-1657 OR BOB LIVERMORE AT (612) 239-3954. <sup>FROM SOUTHWEST IOWA</sup>, WE HAVE HAD NO FURTHER NEWS ABOUT THE BOHEMIAN WAXWING SEEN ON DEC. 3<sup>RD</sup> AT PONY CREEK PARK NEAR GLENWOOD.

IN SOUTHEAST IOWA, UP TO 11 EUROPEAN TREE SPARROWS HAVE BEEN PRESENT NORTH OF BURLINGTON SINCE DECEMBER 9<sup>TH</sup>, AND WERE STILL THERE ON JANUARY 7<sup>TH</sup>. FOR UPDATES AND DIRECTIONS CALL CHUCK FAUER AT (319) 753-0710. IN OTHER SOUTHEAST IOWA NEWS, 12 WHITE WINGED CROSSBILLS WERE IN HEMLOCKS NEAR THE LODGE AT EAGLE POINT PARK IN CLINTON ON THE 5<sup>TH</sup>.

IN JEWELL COUNTY, 2 SHORT EARED OWLS WERE SEEN CONSISTENTLY, <sup>LAST WEEK IN</sup> LATE AFTERNOON <sup>FLYING</sup> OVER A WEEDY FIELD, WHICH IS FOUND BY GOING WEST 3 MILES FROM THE HIGHWAY 218 AND MELROSE AVENUE INTERCHANGE AT IOWA CITY, THEN NORTH 1 1/4 MILE AND EAST 1 1/4 MILE ON A DIRT ROAD, WHICH IS DIFFICULT TO DRIVE IF TEMPERATURES ARE ABOUT FREEZING. A SNOW YUNET OWL WAS FOUND IN CEDARS ON THE <sup>COUNTRY ROAD</sup> NORTH SIDE OF, <sup>ABOUT 6 MILES</sup> WEST OF THE NEWCASTLE REFUGE HEADQUARTERS. ON THE 6<sup>TH</sup> AND 7<sup>TH</sup>. AND A LONG-EARED OWL WAS SEEN IN A CEDAR GROVE SOUTHWEST OF THE GREENCASTLE + SWAN LAKE ROAD IN TERRSECTION ON THE 4<sup>TH</sup>. IN IOWA CITY, 3 WHITE WINGED CROSSBILLS WERE OBSERVED ON BOTH THE 6<sup>TH</sup> AND 7<sup>TH</sup>. JUST

AND ON THE 7<sup>TH</sup>, A NORTHERN GOSHAWK NEAR SUTCLIFFE

AND A FLOCK OF GRAY PARTRIDGE NEAR SOUTH CEDAR WILDLIFE

AREA IN EXTREME NORTHERN AND NORTHEASTERN JOHNSON COUNTY  
AND BARBARA BOICE HAS A RUFUS SIDED TOWHEE AT HER FEEDER  
AND NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD IN HER YARD NORTH OF OXFORD AS AT THESE

IN NORTHEAST IOWA, AN IMMATURE GOLDEN EAGLE WAS OBSERVED BEING HARASSED BY A COOPER'S HAWK ALONG ALLAMAKEE COUNTY ROAD A-26 SOUTHWEST OF NEW ALBEN.

IN LINN COUNTY, 3 LONG EARED OWLS WERE LOCATED IN A PINE GROVE AT THE ARBORETUM AREA OF MORGAN CREEK PARK JUST NORTHWEST OF CEDAR RAPIDS OFF HIGHWAY 94, ON THE 6<sup>TH</sup>, AND A NORTHERN GOSHAWK AT THAT LOCATION ON THE 3<sup>RD</sup>.

AND AT CEDAR LAKE IN CEDAR RAPIDS, THE <sup>FEMALE</sup> OLD SCARF WAS LAST SEEN DECEMBER 31<sup>ST</sup>, BUT THE HOODED MEGARHREE, WOOD DUCKS AND PIE BILLED GREEN WERE STILL THERE ON THE 7<sup>TH</sup>.

IN CENTRAL IOWA, A RED SHOULDERED HAWK WAS ALONG HIGHWAY 405 SOUTH OF POLK CITY ON THE 2<sup>ND</sup>, AND 3 COMMON REDPOLES WERE AT THE BASE OF THE SPYLOREVILLE DEMON THE 4<sup>TH</sup>. IN MARSHALLTOWN, A BROWN THRASHER AT A FEEDER ON THE 6<sup>TH</sup> AND 3 WHITE-WINGED CROSSBILLS IN HEMLOCKS AT THE MARSHALLTOWN CEMETERY ON THE NORTH SIDE OF TOWN ON THE 7<sup>TH</sup>

AND FINALLY, THE MINNESOTA HOTLINE REPORTS AN IRruption OF PINE GROSBEAKS INTO THE CENTRAL PART OF THAT STATE. LOOK FOR THEM IN IOWA, AT FEEDERS AND ORNAMENTAL FRUIT TREES.
