THE PASSERINE MIGRATION IS VIRTUALLY OVER WITH BUT A FEW LATE WARBLER AND FLYCATCHER REPORTS.

~~From Southeast Iowa, the prairie warbler, first discovered in Hickory Hill Park in Iowa City on May 23 was still singing its heart out as one observer described it, on ^{EACH DAY SINCE} ~~BOTH THE 26TH AND 27TH~~. To look for this bird, go ^{AT EXIT 246} 1 mile south of I-80 on Highway 1 then exit ~~to~~ ^{EAST} onto Conklin Street across from the Hy Uff Store and drive to the north parking lot. From there walk northeast into the woods and down a hill where the path forks go left ^{AND} ^{WALK} ⁴⁰⁰ ^{YARDS} come out in the field with scattered shrubs. Walk east in the field and listen for the bird. Also at Hickory Hill, a ^{AN ALDER FLYCATCHER AND} Connecticut warbler on the 26th, and Alder flycatcher and 2 white-eyed vireos on the 27th. Also in Johnson County at the Carlisle Reservoir a peregrine falcon was seen twice at the Barlock access on the 26th along with a black-bellied plover. In addition, a Louisiana water-thrush at Cou Falls and 15 downy south of Tom's Pond on the 26th and an ^{A MILE} ^{POCKET} west of the headquarters building along County Road F20 on the 27th.~~

Still in Southeast Iowa at the Croton Unit of Shinnec State Forest in Lee County mourning, Kentucky, blue-winged, and Cerulean warblers, yellow-breasted chat, white-eyed vireo and

YELLOW-BELLIED FLYCATCHER ON THE 26TH. AT LEODE STATE PARK IN HENRY COUNTY, A CONFUSED COMMON LOON ON THE 26TH AND AT CONE MARSH IN LOUISA COUNTY A NUMBER OF WILLOW FLYCATCHERS, 2 LEAST BITTERNS, AND ON THE EAST SIDE 2 DUNLINS, ALL ON THE 27TH.

IN CENTRAL IOWA, 2 SUMMER TANAGERS AT BRAND'S WOODS IN DES MOINES ON THE 25TH, 14 CATTLE EGGETS AT DUNBAR SLOUGH IN GREENE COUNTY AND LONG POND IN BUTTLE COUNTY ON THE 25TH, AND A SHARP-TAILED SPARROW AT THE SNAKE CREEK AREA NEAR PERRY ON THE 24TH. AT PINE LAKE STATE PARK IN HARDEN COUNTY 14 WARBLER SPECIES INCLUDING 7 MOURNINGS AND A CANADA ON THE 22ND AND 25TH AT GRAMMER GROVE PARK IN MARSHALL COUNTY, 3 PHILADELPHIA VIREOS, 5 YELLOW-BELLIED FLYCATCHERS, 3 MOURNING AND A CONNECTICUT WARBLER ON THE 26TH.

IN NORTHEAST IOWA AT CARDINAL MARSH IN WINNEBAGO COUNTY 2 EARLY GREBS AND A LEAST BITTERN ON THE 23RD.
IN THE NORTHWEST, COLUMBIAN WARBLER AND NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD AT SPENCER ON THE 27TH.
