PARK BOUNDARY. THIS FIELD IS REACHED FROM THE NORTH
PARKING LOT BY WALKING NORTHEAST THROUGH THE WOOD AND DOWN
A HILL, THEN LEFT AT A 'Y' IN THE PATH AND YOU WILL COME
TO THE FIELD. WALK EAST THROUGH THE FIELD AND LISTEN FOR
THE BIRD. THE NORTH PARKING LOT IS FOUND BY EXITING
HIGHWAY 1 IN NORTHEAST IOWA CITY ONTO CONKLIN STREET
WHICH IS ACROSS THE STREET FROM THE DOBE STREET
HOVDEE STORE.

IPLAOSSE. THERE SEEMED TO BE A LARGED WARMER FRONT
ON THE 18TH AND CONTINUING THROUGH THE 20TH DUE TO
THE WEATHER. FROM NORTHEAST IOWA, IN ALLAMAKEE COUNTY
4 CATTLE EGRETS NEAR THE IOWA-MINNESOTA BORDER AT
NEW ALBIN. AT POOL SLOUGH NEAR NEW ALBIN A NUMBER OF
PROTONOTARY CARRIERS AND HOODED MELLANES, ALL ON
THE 20TH. AT PIKE'S PEAK STATE PARK IN LEWATON COUNTY
14 WARBLER SPECIES INCLUDING GOLDEN-WINGED ON THE 20TH. IN
WINNEBAGO COUNTY AT CARDINAL MARSH, 48 RUFFIN DUCKS,

ZORRAL SLOUGH IN CLERMONT COUNTY, BLACK CROWDED NIGHT HERON, STILT AND WHITE RUMPED SANDPIPER, DUNLIN, SHORT BILLED DOVITCHERS; DEERSON'S PHALAROPES PLUS 2 REDHEAD DUCKS, AND FORSTER'S AND BLACK TERN ON THE 17TH.

IN NORTHWEST TOWN, ^{ON AN ISLAND} 48 RED NECKED PHALAROPES WERE REPORTED FROM THE EAST SIDE OF MUD LAKE IN LAY COUNTY ON THE 20TH.

IN THE SOUTHEAST IN JOHN SON COUNTY, 19 WARBLER PELES AND YELLOW BELLED FLYCATCHER AT TOWN CITY'S HICKORY HILL PARK ON THE 18TH, AND A NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD EAST OF THE NORTH PARKING LOT ON THE 19TH. AT THE CONDUVE RESERVOIR, AT THE END OF THE BASCOCK ACCESS, WILLET, RUFFY TURNSTONE, DUNLIN, BLACK BELLED PLOVER, DOVITCHERS, AND A NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD ALONG THE ACCESS ROAD ON THE 18TH AND 19TH. NEAR THE HEADQUARTERS BUILDING ALONG CROFTY ROAD F-20 15 HORSERAIN COONITS ON THE 18TH AND AT THE DUPONT BRIDGE 2 LITTLE EGRETS, CASWINS FORSTER'S AND BLACK TERN ON THE 19TH AND A SUB ADULT MISSISSIPPI KITE ON THE 19TH FLYING OVER THE BASCOCK PARKING LOT.

IN EASTERN TOWN A BLACK NECKED CRESTED Ibis WAS SEEN BRIEFLY AT DAVENPORT ON THE 17TH, BUT COULD NOT BE RELOCATED.
