THE NEW REPORTS FROM BURLINGTON IN
PES MOUNT COUNTY; AN EARLY BROWN THRESHER,
3 PLAINING WOODCOCK, AND AN AMAZINGLY
EARLY TREE SWALLOW ON THE 14TH. AT COVE
MARSH IN LOUDON COUNTY ON THE 12TH 12 DUCK
SPECIES INCLUDING BOTH TEAL AND A RINGY, ~~6~~ 6
BLACKBIRD SPECIES, INCLUDING BREWERS + RUSTY AND
A VERY EARLY AMERICAN BITTERN IN THE AREA OF
THE MAIN DIKE. THE BITTERN WAS ^{HEARD BOOMING} IN THE COVE AREA
ON THE 15TH AND THE FLOCK OF 150 SNOW
GESE STILL HAD 2 ROSS' GEESE WHICH RELOCATED
IN A FARM FIELD A MILE WEST OF COVE MARSH
ON THE 15TH. AN EARLY MALE YELLOW HEADED
BLACKBIRD WAS ^{SEEN} NORTH OF IOWA CITY ALONG ROAD
W-66 NEAR THE SOURCE POINT TURSWORT, ON THE 13TH
IN NE IOWA, IN ALLAMAKEE COUNTY, NESTING
BOLD FINGER AND AT FISH FARM POND SOUTH OF
NEW ALBIN A GREAT BLUE HERON AND 12 DUCK
SPECIES ON THE 12TH AND AN EASTERN PHOEBE
AT ONSLOW IN JONES COUNTY

THE STORMS AND TORNADOS WITHIN TWO DAYS OF EACH OTHER - THAT'S IOWA. WINTER ONE DAY AND SPRING THE NEXT. THE SPRING HAS WON OUT RECENTLY AND WATERFOWL, BLACKBIRDS, BLUEBIRDS, ROBINS, MEADOWLARKS AND KILDEER ARE NOW EVERYWHERE. THE BEST BIRDS OF THE WEEK ARE ICELAND GULL IN EASTERN IOWA AND RED NECKED GREBE NEAR DES MOINES.

ON MARCH 11, A RED NECKED GREBE WAS SEEN ALONG THE WEST SHORE AT DACE MUFFET RESERVOIR NEAR DES MOINES. ALSO THERE WAS AN EARLY HORNSHED GEESE. THERE ARE MANY OTHER REPORTS FROM EASTERN IOWA AND ONE OBSERVED 140 54 SWANS INCL. 17 DUCK SPECIES ON THE 11TH. AT TESTER PARK NORTH OF DES MOINES, 150 COMMON REDPODS IN A GROUP NEAR THE BOAT LAUNCH AREA, 30 BALD EAGLES, 9 OF WHICH WERE ADULTS, A TURKEY VULTURE, A RED BREASTED MERGANSER, AND A FIST OR TWO WINTER CLANCY'S GULL OUT FROM THE BOTTOM, AN EARLY HORNSHED GEESE, ^{WAD} OFF THE JETTY AT LAKEVIEW RECREATIONAL AREA OF THE SPYERVILLE RESERVOIR, AND GREATER SCAUP AT CROWN POINT POND IN JEWELL, WHICH ARE CLOSE TO THE ROAD & EASY TO COMPARE TO THE LESSER SCAUP ^{AND A WHITE FRONDED GOOSE AT COLLECTOR LAKE IN NEWARK IN MARSHALL COUNTY, GREATER SCAUP} AT THE USCOMB SEWAGE POND ON THE 9TH & 10TH AND 200 LAPLAND LONGSPURS ON THE 11TH. AT HENDRICKSON MARSH IN STORY COUNTY 400 SNOW GEESE, RUSTY BLACKBIRDS AND NORTHERN HARRIERS ON THE 10TH, AND AN EARLY PIED BILLED GREBE AT UNION LEAGUE LAKE IN TAMA COUNTY ON THE 11TH. AT RED ROCK RESERVOIR IN MARION 1000'S OF GUINS FEEDING AS

SHAD BELOW THE DAM AND RESTING ON THE LAKE ABOVE
THE DAM - MOSTLY RING BILLED, BUT A FRANKLIN'S
ON THE 10TH AND A GLAUCOUS ON THE 8TH. AND
THE SNOW BUNTING FLOOR WAS STILL AT THE BEACH
OF WHITEBREAST RECREATION AREA ON THE 10TH.

AT THE END OF CITIES, A FIRST WINTER ICELAND
GULL WAS DISCOVERED ON ^{THE MISSING LINE} MARCH 9 OUT FROM
ARSENAL ISLAND AND WAS ALSO SEEN IN MID-
RIVER ON THE AFTERNOON OF THE 10TH FROM
THE PARKWAY ALONG RIVER DRIVEN IN MOULNE
ABOUT A MILE ABOVE THE I-74 BRIDGE. AN
IMMATURE THAYER'S GULL AND GREATER SCAUP
WERE ALSO IN THE AREA ON THE 9TH. OTHER
SE TOUR NEWS, 2 ROLL'S GEESE WERE IN A
GROUP OF 150 SNOW GEESE ON THE EAST SIDE
OF COVE MARSH IN LOUISA COUNTY ON THE 18TH
AND A HARRI'S SPARROW WAS AT SAND POINT OF
THE CORACINE RESERVOIR ON THE 10TH.
