~~IN SOUTH CENTRAL IOWA, NEAR OSCEOLA, THE MALE EVENING GRASSHOPPER WAS BACK AT BETH BROWN'S FEEDER ON THE 23RD YOU CAN CALL BETH FOR UPDATES AT (515) 392-2783.~~ ^{IN SOUTH CENTRAL IOWA} AT RED ROCK RESERVOIR IN MARION COUNTY 23 TURKEY VULTURES AT THEIR ROOST, AND 10 TREE SWALLOWS ON THE 20TH, AND ON THE 25TH, 275 WHITE PELICANS IN BACKWATER SOUTH OF THE HIGHWAY 14 BRIDGE, AND 1 SNOW BUNTING STER AT THE BEACH OF WHITEBREATH RECREATION ^{AREA} AND 2 AMERICAN CIPITS IN NORTHERN WARREN COUNTY.

IN CENTRAL IOWA ON THE 25TH, 4 SNOW BUNTINGS AT JETTER PARK, AND HORNED GREBE NEAR THE DAM AT SPYGLASS LAKE AND A FRANKLIN'S GULL, AN NORTH OF DES MOINES AND AT BRENTON SLOUGH IN DALLAS COUNTY, A PECTORAL SANDPIPER ON THE 24TH.

IN SOUTHWEST IOWA, AN OLDSQUAW AND 2 GREY SCUP AT THE IOL SETTING PONDS SOUTH OF COUNCIL BLUFFS, AND AT LAKE MANAWA, AN ERLED GREBE ^{ON THE} ON THE 22ND.

THE LAKES IN THE NORTHERN PART OF THE STATE HAVE OPENED UP THIS PAST WEEK AND IT SEEMS TO BE THE HEIGHT OF THE WATERFOWL MIGRATION IN THE STATE. PROBABLY THE WEEK'S BEST BIRDS ARE SMITH'S LONG-SPURS IN SOUTHEAST IOWA.

ON MARCH 24 AND 25, FLOCKS OF SMITH'S LONGSPURS WERE FOUND NORTHWEST OF LONE TREE IN JOHNSON COUNTY. TO LOOK FOR THESE BIRDS, FROM THE NORTH EDGE OF LONE TREE GO WEST ON HIGHWAY 22 1 MILE THEN NORTH ON GRAVEL 1.4 MILES AND LOOK IN A SHORT GRASS FIELD EAST OF THE ROAD. IF YOU DON'T FIND THEM THERE GO NORTH TO THE NEXT INTERSECTION THEN EAST .3-4 MILE AND LOOK ON BOTH SIDES OF ROAD, ESPECIALLY ON THE NORTH IN THE FIELD WITH LARGE ROUND HAY BALES. YOU PROBABLY WILL HAVE TO WALK INTO THE FIELD TO SCARE THEM UP. THERE ARE ALSO MANY LAPLAND LONGSPURS IN BREEDING PLUMAGE IN THE LONE TREE AREA. TRY GOING WEST ON HIGHWAY 22, THEN SOUTH 1 MILE AND LOOK IN THE SECTION TO THE SOUTHWEST OF THAT INTERSECTION, ESPECIALLY IN THE LOW WET SPOTS OF THE PLOWED FIELD -

IN OTHER SOUTHEAST IOWA NEWS, AT CONE MARSH IN LOUISA COUNTY ON THE 25TH 15 DUCK SPECIES, A ^{GOLDEN CROWNED KINGLET'S} VESPER SPARROW, AND FROM THE EAST OVERLOOK AN AMERICAN PIPIT AND WHEATBILLS. IN JOHNSON COUNTY AT THE CORNVILLE RESERVOIR ON THE 24TH MANY DUCKS + GEESE, INCLUDING ALL 3, MERGANSERS, GREAT BLUE HERONS, SANDHILL STURGS 1 MILE WEST OF THE HAWKEYE REFUGE
