

REPORTS OF POST BREEDING DISPERSAL LITTLE BLUE HERONS AND SNOWY EGRET ARE THE WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS. IN CENTRAL IOWA, A SNOWY EGRET WAS FOUND ON AUGUST 5TH IN A FLOODED FIELD, WHICH WAS LOCATED JUST NORTH OF MARSHAL TOWN BETWEEN HIGHWAY 14 AND THE NEXT ROAD WEST. ALSO IN CENTRAL IOWA 38 WHITE PELICANS WERE COUNTED AT THE SAYLORVILLE RESERVOIR ABOUT 3/4 MILE NORTH OF THE MILAN 17 BRIDGE.

THE LITTLE BLUE HERONS WERE SEEN IN SOUTHWEST IOWA AT THE CORALVILLE RESERVOIR IN JOHNSON COUNTY. A WHITE IMMATURE BIRD WAS FIRST DISCOVERED ON AUGUST FIRST, AND WAS SEEN EACH DAY SINCE AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS IN FLOODED FIELDS ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE RESERVOIR. ON AUGUST 4TH AND 5TH, IT WAS WITH GREAT EGRETS ALONG THE HANGING ROCK ROAD. AN ADULT WAS OBSERVED WITH GREAT BLUE HERONS, ^{ON THE 4TH} IN A FLOODED FIELD ABOUT A HALF MILE NORTH AND A MILE WEST OF WILLIAMS PRAIRIE. AND ANOTHER WHITE IMMATURE WAS SEEN FROM ^{ON THE 4TH} EAST ROAD AT CONE MARSH IN LOUISA COUNTY. ALSO AT CORALVILLE, WHERE THE WATER IS AGAIN RISING, SOME WHERPHOES INCLUDING SHORT BILLED DOVETAIL, SALT SANDPIPER AND SEMIPALMATED PLOVER. AND ANOTHER LOCATION IN WESTERN JOHNSON COUNTY FOR MOCKINGBIRD, AS 2 WERE SOUTH OF COUNTY ROAD F28 ABOUT 1 1/2 MILES AND WEST OF I-380 ABOUT 2 1/2 MILES. ALSO IN THAT SAME AREA WERE A LARGE

NUMBER OF VESTRES, AN UPLAND SANDPIPER AND A
LOGHEAD SHrike, ALL THESE SIGHTINGS ON THE 4TH.

IN THE SOUTHWEST, A PIPING PLOVER AND A LEAST
TERN AT THE IRL SETTING Ponds SOUTH OF
COUNCIL BLAIFES ON THE 4TH ^{ALSO THERE WERE 50+ DOWNY NECKS} AND ^{STILT SANDPIPERS} THERE ARE FOREST
STILL GOOD NUMBERS OF BLUE GRACKLES AND ^{BLACK} ^{THROAT}
WESTERN KINGBIRDS IN THE MISSOURI RIVER PLAIN IN
FRAMONT AND MILLS COUNTIES.
