

IN EAST CENTRAL IOWA, ALONG THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER IN THE QUAS CITIES AREA, AN ADULT LESSER BLACK BACKED GULL WAS DISCOVERED ON 17TH OF THE 17TH. IT WAS SEEN AGAIN THE MORNINGS OF THE 18TH & 19TH FROM THE IOWA'S SIDE ON THE ICE OUT FROM THE CAPTAIN'S TABLE RESTAURANT ALONG RIVER DRIVE IN MOLINE, ABOUT 2 MILES UPSTREAM FROM THE I-74 BRIDGE. IT WAS LOCATED AGAIN ON THE AFTERNOON OF THE 18TH STANDING AT THE SOUTH END OF A NEGOY ISLAND A LITTLE OVER A MILE NORTH OF LECLAIRE ALONG HIGHWAY 67. THERE ARE MANY CARS AND DUCKS IN THE AREA, INCLUDING SEVERAL GREATER SCAUPS BOTH ABOVE AND BELOW LOCK & DAM #4, AND 2 TUNDRA SWANS ABOUT 2 MILES NORTH OF LECLAIRE.

AND NORTH OF FAIRFIELD IN JEFFERSON COUNTY, A HARRIER AND 2 MEADOWLARKS. AND A MILE WEST OF HOMESTEAD IN TOWA COUNTY A SAW WHET OWL AT THE ICE POOL AREA OF THE AMASA WOODS ON THE 17TH, IN LEE COUNTY, AND, AN EASTERN BLUEBIRD NEAR KEOKAK ON THE 19TH.
