

WHITE EYED, RED EYED AND YELLOW THROATED ZEPHOS, WILSON'S PHALAROPES AND SCARLET TANAGER.

IN THE SOUTHWEST, A PAIR OF CINNAMON TEAL IN FRAGMENT COUNTRY. FROM THE TOWN OF TOLSON, GO EAST OUT OF TOWN ON ORANGE STREET FOR 4 MILES THEN 1/8 MILE SOUTH AND LOOK IN THE SEWAGE LAGOON ON THE EAST SIDE OF THE ROAD.

IN NORTHWEST TOWN, AT PONT NEAL CENTRAL STATION IN WOODBURY COUNTY LITTLE BLUE HERON WITH 400 WHITE FRONTED GEESE ON THE 25TH, WHITE FACED IBIS, ROSS'S GOOSE, PIPING PLOVER, 12 EARED GRAYBES AND HUDSONIAN COCKIT, ON THE 26TH AND LONG BILLED DOWITCHER ON THE 27TH. IN CLAY COUNTY AT MUD LAKE AND DAN GREENE SLough WILLETS, WILSON'S PHALAROPES, MARSHED COCKIT ON THE 29TH AND PARULA WARRBLER IN WEST SPENCER. AND AT VIRGIN LAKE IN PALO ALTO COUNTY, 35 LESSER GOLDEN PLOVER ON THE 29TH.

IN THE NORTHEAST, IN ALLAMANCE COUNTY, A PEREGRINE FALCON ALONG HIGHWAY 76 NEAR ROSVILLE, AND WILLETS, SAND AND VIRGINIA RAIL AT POOL SLough NEAR NEW ALBANY, ALL ON THE 28TH. AT EFFIGY MOUNDS 3 OVENBIRDS. IN WINNEBIEG COUNTY, GREAT CRESTED FLYCATCHER AT DELORME AND WHITE FRONTED GEESE AT CARDINAL MARSH.

MIGRATION HAS BEEN IN FULL SWING, AND A NUMBER OF EXCITING BIRDS WERE REPORTED FROM ALL PARTS OF THE STATE LAST WEEK.

IN CENTRAL IOWA, AT BOY'S BRANCH IN GUTHRIE COUNTY WHITE FACED IBIS AND PIPING PLOVER ON APRIL 29TH ^{IN PARTICULAR} AT THE Saylorville Reservoir 19 AVOCETS, 9 WILLETS, AND FORSTER'S TERNS AT THE BEACH OF SANDPIPER RECREATION AREA ON THE 27TH, AND AT ^{BRANCH OF} BIG CREEK STATE PARK 4 WILLETS, AND A HORNED GREBE AT THE DAM ON THE 27TH. AT MCKLEY PRAIRIE NEAR ROCK CITY 2 UPLAND SANDPIPERS ON THE 27TH AT RED ROCK RESERVOIR IN MARION COUNTY 2 CATTLE EGRETS NEAR THE MILE LONG BRIDGE AND FORSTER'S TERNS AND BONAPARTE'S Gulls BELOW THE DAM ON THE 29TH. AND MIGRANTS IN WARREN COUNTY ON THE 29TH, EASTERN PEEWEE, LEAST FLYCATCHER, AND SOLITARY WIRE. AT BRENTON SUMMIT IN DAWES COUNTY, 10 WARBLES SPECIES ON THE 29TH, INCLUDING BLACKBURN AND WILSONS - ALSO A COOPER'S HAWK.

IN THE SOUTHWEST AT THE CROTON UNIT OF SWIMMER STATE FOREST ON THE 29TH MANY WARBLES INCLUDING KENTUCKY AND BLUE WINGED, AND YELLOW BREASTED CHAT, SUMMER TANAGER, AND ORCHARD ORIOLE. AT BULLINGTON A SNOWY PLOVER PUT IN A BRIEF APPEARANCE ON THE 28TH AND WAS GONE THE NEXT MORNING - THIS WOULD BE A SECOND STATE RECORD. AT THE CORALVILLE RESERVOIR, A CATTLE EGRET AT THE END OF THE BABCOCK ACCESS ROAD ON THE 29TH, AND DURING THE PAST SEVERAL DAYS BOTH HUDSONIAN AND MARBLED GODWIT, LONG-BILLED DOWITCHER, DUNLIN AND LESSER GOLDEN PLOVER. AT THE AMMAA WOODS IN TOWNSHIP COUNTY ON THE 28TH RED BREASTED NUTHATCH, WINTER WREN

AT OTTER CREEK MARSH IN TAMM COUNTY ON THE
27TH AND 29TH. BLACK CROWNED NIGHT HERONS, AMERI-
CAN BITTERS, MANY SARAS AND 6 VIRGINIA RAILS,
MARSH AND SEDGE WREN'S AND 2 GREAT TRILED
GRACKLES

IN NORTH CENTRAL TAMM IN TERRY GORDO COUNTY ON
THE 28TH 100 RUMY DUCKS AND 2 CANONBACKS AT VASTERS
MARSH, WINTER WREN, WILLET, WILSON'S PHALAROPE AT
BALLARD MARSH AND AT ZIRBED SLough, 30 WHITE
FRONTED LEER, KOSTER'S TERN AND 2 VIRGINIA RAILS AND
IN THE COUNTY SOLITARY VIREO, NORTHERN WATER THRESH and
HARRIS SPARROW.
