

THERE HAVE BEEN FEW REPORTS OF WARBLERS, AND NO LARGE NUMBERS OF SPECIES OR UNUSUAL SPECIES THE PAST WEEK. THE BEST BIRDS ARE 2 WHITE FACED IBIS IN GUTHRIE COUNTY.

REPORTS FROM CENTRAL IOWA, 2 WHITE FACED IBIS AT THE NORTH END OF BAY'S BRANCH IN GUTHRIE COUNTY ON MAY 5<sup>TH</sup>. ALSO SEEN THERE WERE BAIRD'S SANDPIPER, DUNLIN, WHITE RUMPED SANDPIPER, LOON AND SHORT BILLED DOWITCHER AND WILLET. ALSO IN GUTHRIE COUNTY AT LAKES SPRINGS, A FEMALE GREAT TAILED GRACKLE AND A BLACK CROWNED NIGHT HERON ON THE 6<sup>TH</sup>. AT THE BEACH OF SANDPIPEL RECREATION AREA OF THE SOUTHERN RESERVOIR IN POLK COUNTY CASPIAN AND EASTERN TERNS, BONAPARTE'S LIMB, SPURWINKLE, PIPING PLOVER, LONG BILLED DOWITCHER, WILLET, AND DUNLING <sup>ON THE 5TH & 6TH</sup> AND AT BIG CREEK STATE PARK A LINGERING COMMON LOON ON THE 6<sup>TH</sup>. A LATE ROUGH LAUGHED HAWK WAS SEEN IN BOONE COUNTY ON THE 5<sup>TH</sup>; AND COOPED'S HAWKS ARE NESTING AT WOODLAND MEADOW PRESERVE IN MARION COUNTY. IN STORY COUNTY, AT COLO POND 8 SPECIES OF SHOREBIRDS, INCLUDING LESSER GOLDEN PLOVER AND DOWITCHERS. AND A HUMMINGBIRD GEMINI AT LARSON MARSH ON THE 2<sup>ND</sup>. AN INJURED BARRED OWL WAS RECOVERED NEAR SWAN IN MARION COUNTY ON APRIL 30<sup>TH</sup>.
