MOULNE OUT FROM THE CAPTAIN'S TABLE RESTAURANT
ALONG RIVER DRIVE.

A GROUP FROM CEDAR RAPIDS AUDUBON BIRDEN THE
DULUTH, MINNESOTA AREA ON THE 23RD + 24TH AND
SAW MANY GOOD BIRDS INCLUDING GREAT GREY &
SNOWY OWLS, SPRUCE GROUSE, ~~AND~~ NORTHERN LEAPOD AND
BOREAL CHICKADEE.

IN NEW REPORTS TODAY, AT THE CORALVILLE 205-
ERAIL IN TAYLORSON COUNTY, A LOSS'S GOOSE AND 3
WHITE FRONDED GEESSE WERE WITH A SMALL FLOCK OF CANADAS.
THEY WERE SEEN FROM THE CAMPGROUNDS AT THE NECK
OVERLOOK, AND THE FLOCK OF SNOW BUNTINGS WAS
STILL AT THE BEACH AREA AT THE WHITEBREAST REED EAST
AREA OF THE RED ROCK RESERVOIR.

News of TWO PRAIRIE FALCON ~~RECORD~~ HIGHLIGHT THE WEEK'S BIRDS. ON FEB. 20TH IN HARDIN COUNTY, A PRAIRIE FALCON WAS SEEN ALONG HIGHWAY 359 ABOUT 4 MILES SOUTH OF ALDEN. THIS WAS THE 3RD TIME SINCE NOVEMBER THAT MARK PROESCHLICK HAS SEEN A PRAIRIE FALCON ^{IN BLACKHAWK CO.} IN THE SAME GENERAL AREA. THE 2ND BIRD, WAS SEEN LEAVING ITS ROOSTING AREA AT 6:45 AM ON THE 22ND. THE ROOSTING LOCATION IS IN A SILO IN A GROUP OF EIGHT SILOS ON THE NORTH SIDE OF HIGHWAY 175 ABOUT 5 MILES EAST OF REINBECK. A FALCON WAS OBSERVED BY MANY PEOPLE LAST YEAR IN FEBRUARY AND MARCH AT THIS SAME SITE.

IN OTHER NORTHEAST IOWA SIGHTINGS, AN IMMATURE GOLDEN EAGLE ALONG ALLAMAKEE COUNTY ROAD A-26, ABOUT 5 MILES SOUTHWEST OF NEW ALBIN ON THE 20TH, AND AN ADULT TUNDRA SWAN IN A SMALL POND ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF HIGHWAY 20 IN BLACKHAWK COUNTY JUST WEST OF THE JESUP EXIT. AND MRS. ROBERT SNACKER OF MANCHESTER REPORTED A HOUSE FINCH AT HER FEEDER 2 DAYS LAST WEEK.

IN SOUTH CENTRAL IOWA, AT RED ROCK RESERVOIR REPORTS FROM THE 21ST AND 25TH INDICATED QUITE A FEW BALD EAGLES, SNOW AND CANADA GEESE, ABOUT A DOZEN DUCK SPECIES, INCLUDING 1000'S OF COMMON MEGANANAS, 4 GREATER SCAUPS, 3 BLACK DUCES BELOW THE DAM, LARGE #'S OF GROSSES, MOSTLY RING-BILLED AND AT WHITEBREAST RECREATION AREA
