IN NEW REPORTS TODAY, AT THE QUAD CITIES,  
A FIRST YEAR HULLAND GULL WAS SEEN ON THE MISSISSIPPI  
RIVER FROM ARSENAL ISLAND ON THE ILLINOIS  
SIDE. ALSO PRESENT WAS AN IMMATURE THAYER'S  
GULL AND GREATER SCAUP

FROM DEL MOINES, 2 BELATED REPORTS WITHOUT  
DETAILS, ONE OF A SNOWY OWL IN NORTHWEST DEL  
MOINES ON THE 24TH OF FEB. AND A LARGE FLOCK  
IN DOWNTOWN ON THE 25TH.

AT THE CONROVILLE RESERVOIR, A DOZEN BIRD  
EAGLES WERE ~~SEEN~~ I-380 CROSSES IT

NORTHWARD BOUND BIRDS ARE TRICKLING BACK INTO THE STATE. BESIDES WATERFOWL, BLACKBIRDS, ROBINS, AND KILLOFER APPEARED IN GREATER NUMBERS LAST WEEK, AND RED TAILED HAWKS ARE MOVING.

PRETTY MUCH THE SAME MIX OF WATERFOWL WAS REPORTED FROM SEVERAL AREAS IN THE STATE THIS WEEKEND INCLUDING RED ROCK AND CORAUVILLE RESERVOIRS, LAKE MACBRIDE AND CONE MARSH. LARGE NUMBERS OF COMMON MERGANSERS, AND GOLDEN EYE, SOME BUFFLEHEAD, SCAMP, HOOPED MERGANSERS AND SOME OF THE PURPLE DUCKS AS WELL.

MARCH 2-4 A PAIR OF GOOSE AND 10 WHITE FRONTED GEESE WERE VISIBLE AT THE CORAUVILLE RESERVOIR FROM THE WEST OVERLOOK CAMPGROUNDS AREA, AND A COMMON HAWK AT THE JOLLY ROGER AREA. IN OTHER SOUTHEAST IOWA SIGHTINGS AT BURLINGTON IN DES MOINES COUNTY 2 RED BREASTED MERGANSERS, 3 EARLY TURKEY VULTURES, A WOOD COCK <sup>DISPLACING</sup> AND A SAW WHET OWL, ALL ON THE 4<sup>TH</sup> AND FOR MORE INFORMATION YOU CAN CALL CHUCK FULMER AT (319) 753-0710.

IN CENTRAL IOWA AT JESTER PARK IN POLK COUNTY, 109 REDPOLLS WERE FOUND 200 YARDS NORTH OF THE BOAT LAUNCH. ~~AND~~ A SAW WHET OWL WAS <sup>ALSO</sup> DISCOVERED AT JESTER AND YOU CAN GET DIRECTIONS FROM PAM OR REID ALLEN AT (515) 273-0563. AT RED ROCK RESERVOIR IN MARION COUNTY, BESIDES NUMEROUS WATERFOWL, EGGS, AND GULLS, THE PAIR OF SNOW BUNTINGS WERE

STILL PRESENT AT THE BEACH OF THE WHITEBREAST RECREATION AREA ON THE 4<sup>TH</sup>.

IN NORTHEAST IOWA, AN ADULT GOLDEN EAGLE WAS OBSERVED OVER THE UPPER IOWA RIVER BUNTS ALONG ALLAMAKEE COUNTY ROAD A-26, 7 MILES SOUTHWEST OF NEW ALBANY ON THE 3<sup>RD</sup> AT CEDAR RAPIDS, A LOGGERHEAD SNAKE ALONG BLAIR'S FERRY ROAD NEAR THE CEDAR RIVER BRIDGE ON THE 4<sup>TH</sup> AND COMMON REDPOLLS AT JOUCE AND TIM DURBIN'S FEEDER, AND YOU CAN CALL THEM AT (319) 377-7199. THE PRAIRIE FALCON EAST OF REINBECK WAS LOOKED FOR BUT NOT SEEN ON THE 2<sup>ND</sup> AND 3<sup>RD</sup>. FIVE LONG EARED OWLS AT THE ERNIE WRIGHT FARM NEAR ELICADER ON THE 4<sup>TH</sup>, A PRAIRIE GOOSE FALCON AT ST.
