

IN NEW REPORTS TODAY, BOTH COF AVOCETS IN CENTRAL IOWA,  
15 AVOCETS AT NORWALK ON THE WEST SIDE OF COLCHESTER LAKE,  
WHICH IS REACHED BY TAKING BAILEY STREET WEST OF THE EAST  
TRACK CONVENTIONAL STORE AND 19 AVOCETS WERE AT THE  
BEACH OF SANDPIPER RECREATION AREA AT THE SAMARITAN RESERVOIR.  
THANKS TO YOUR RESPONSE FOR MORE INFORMATION, AND  
WE HAVE BEEN DELUGED WITH SIGHTINGS OF GOOD BIRDS  
RECENTLY. THIS THEN IS A NEW REPORT BY SECTION OF THE  
STATE. WE ALSO HAVE HAD A REQUEST ON HOW TO LEAVE A REPORT  
WITHOUT LISTENING TO THE MESSAGE. IF YOU HAVE A TOUCH  
TONE PHONE, JUST PUSH THE 5 AND LEAVE YOUR REPORT  
AFTER THE BEEP.

THE FOLLOWING REPORTS ARE FROM CENTRAL IOWA. IN POLK  
COUNTY AT BIG CREEK STATE PARK 6 AVOCETS AND A  
BAIRD'S SANDPIPER AT THE BEACH AREA AND A HORNS CREEK  
NEAR THE DAM ON THE 19<sup>TH</sup>, AN OSPREY ON THE 14<sup>TH</sup> AND A  
RED SHOULDERED HAWK AT THE SPILLWAY ON THE 15<sup>TH</sup>. AT  
TAYLORVILLE RESERVOIR ON THE 19<sup>TH</sup> NUMEROUS WHITE PELICANS  
AND CONAPARTE'S GULLS, SEVERAL COMMON LOONS AND FASSTER  
TERNS AND A WILLET AT THE BEACH OF SANDPIPER RECREA-  
TION AREA. AT MECKER PRAIRIE NEAR POLK CITY MARBLED GANES ON THE 13<sup>TH</sup>  
IN MADISON COUNTY AT BADGER CREEK STATE PARK,  
THE MALE SURF SCOTER WAS STILL PRESENT ON THE 19<sup>TH</sup>,  
AND THE WHITE WINGED SCOTER WAS FOUND ON A SMALL POND  
SOUTH OF THERE. ALSO AT BADGER CREEK ON THE 19<sup>TH</sup> WERE  
BLACK CROWNED NIGHT HERONS, CASPIAN TERNS, ~~AND~~ FRANKLIN'S  
GULLS FOR DIRECTIONS AND UPDATES CALL GENE ARMSTRONG  
AT (515) 996-2726. IN STACEY COUNTY AT HENDRICKS MARSH  
200 WHITE PELICANS AND 60 SNOW GESE ON THE 15<sup>TH</sup>

IN THE SOUTHWEST, IN POTAWATTAMIE COUNTY, THE DRAKE  
CINNAMON TEAL WAS STILL PRESENT ON THE 19<sup>TH</sup> ~~IN A DRAINAGE DITCH~~  
JUST EAST OF I-29 NEAR THE IPL GENERATING PLANT. EXIT  
I-29 AT HIGHWAY 370 EAST AND IMMEDIATELY GO NORTH ON COUNTY

ROAD L-31 A LITTLE LESS THAN 3 MILES AND LOOK IN THE DRAINAGE DITCH ON THE WEST SIDE OF ROAD BY A MAILBOX WITH THE NAME HECTMAN. AT THE IWL SETTING PONDS PIPING PLOVER, FRANKLINS AND BONAPARTES GULLS ON THE 19<sup>TH</sup>, A SWAINSON'S HAWK ON THE 18<sup>TH</sup>, AND SWAINSONIAN BODWITS BRIEFLY EARLIER IN THE WEEK. AT LAKE MANAWA ON THE 19<sup>TH</sup>, A WHITE WINGED SCOTER ON THE SOUTHWEST SIDE IN THE CANAL, ALSO A SWAINSON'S HAWK, GREAT HORNETS, FORSTER'S TERNS AND WHITE PELICANS. IN MILLS COUNTY, NUMEROUS WHITE PELICANS AND BONAPARTES GULLS IN THE BORROW PITS ALONG I-29, AND A PIPING PLOVER AT FALCON LAKE ON THE 15<sup>TH</sup>.

In Southeast Iowa from Johnson County at the Coraeville Reservoir on the 19<sup>TH</sup>, 14 AVOCETS, 50 WHITE FRONTED GESE AND 12 LESSER GOLDEN PLOVER AT THE END OF THE BABCOCK ACCESS ROAD AND A LE CONTE'S SPARROW FLUSHED FROM THE GRASSY FIELD TO THE WEST OF THAT ACCESS ROAD ON THE 15<sup>TH</sup>; A CATTLE EGRET FLUGGER ON THE 16<sup>TH</sup> ALSO WHITE PELICANS, FORSTER'S TERNS, BONAPARTES GULLS, BALD EAGLES AND OSPREY. AT LAKE MACBRIDE 3 EARED GREBES AND 2 COMMON LOONS ON THE 19<sup>TH</sup> AND CASSIAN TERN ON THE 18<sup>TH</sup>. AT IOWA CITY'S NICKERY HILL PARK, 5 BROAD WINGED HAWKS ON THE 19<sup>TH</sup> NEAR LONE TREE, THE SMITH'S LONGSPURS WERE LAST ~~REPORTED~~ <sup>LOOKED FOR</sup> ON THE 16<sup>TH</sup> AND WERE PRESENT. FROM THE NORTH EDGE OF LONE TREE, GO WEST 1 MILE AND THEN NORTH ~2 MILES AND EAST LESS THAN A HALF MILE TO A FIELD ON THE NORTH SIDE OF ROAD WITH LARGE ROUND HAY BALES. YOU MAY HAVE TO WALK INTO THE FIELD.

IN DE SOTO COUNTY NEAR BARKING TOW A LONG BILLED  
DOWNCHINER AT THE WATER TREATMENT PLANT 1 MILE NORTH OF TOWN  
ALONG HIGHWAY 99 ON THE 14<sup>TH</sup>, AT STRAHL COVE PRESERVE  
ON THE 15<sup>TH</sup> YELLOW THROATED WARBLER, LOUISIANA WATER-  
THRUSH AND SEVERAL CAROLINA WREN AND A PIPING PLOVER  
AT THE CASEY BOARDO LANDING OF THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER  
10 MILES NORTH OF TOWN ON THE 15<sup>TH</sup>. AT CONE MARSH  
IN LOUISA COUNTY ON THE 19<sup>TH</sup>, 3 BLACK CROWNED  
NIGHT HERONS AND A SMALL WHITE FLEET SPIN FROM THE  
EAST OVERLOOK.

IN THE NORTH CENTRAL, IN CERRO GORDO COUNTY, 2  
HENSHAW'S SPARROWS 2 1/2 MILES SOUTHWEST OF PLY-  
MOUTH ON THE 18<sup>TH</sup> AND AT OLD TOWN AT THE PLYMOUTH  
SEWAGE LAGOONS ON THE 14<sup>TH</sup>, NEITHER OF THESE SIGHTINGS  
WAS PRESENT THE NEXT DAY, BUT CURT NEILSON WILL KEEP  
CHECKING ON THE SPARROWS. HIS NUMBER IS (515) 694-5600

9 AVOCETS WERE REPORTED ON THE 20<sup>TH</sup> ON THE NORTH SHORE OF  
CLEAR LAKE BETWEEN THE WATERFRONT RESTAURANT AND THE STATE FISH HATCHERY.  
IN THE NORTHWEST, IN CHEROKEE COUNTY A DRAKE CHAMBERS  
TEAL AND AN AMERICAN BITTERN LAST REPORTED THE 15<sup>TH</sup>,  
FROM PEG TAIL RIDGE ACCESS WHICH IS REACHED BY GOING  
SOUTH FROM CHEROKEE, ON HIGHWAY 59 ~~THEN~~ <sup>3 MILES</sup> THEN WEST ON  
GRAVEL 1 MILE TO A PARKING LOT ADJACENT TO THE MARSH.

IN THE NORTHEAST, IN LINN COUNTY 2 HORNS CREEK  
AT CEDAR LAKE ON THE 18<sup>TH</sup>. AND IN TROUT COUNTY,  
AT OTTER CREEK MARSH SPOTS, BLACK CROWNED NIGHT  
HERON AND WHITE PELICANS ON THE 19<sup>TH</sup>.
