IN NEW NEWS FROM EXTREME SOUTHEAST IOWA, A NUMBER OF GOOD BIRDS ON THE 14TH AND 15TH. IN VAN BUREN COUNTY, NEAR ~~LACEY~~ KEOSAUQUA STATE PARK, SCISSOR-TAILED FLYCATCHER, HENLOW'S SPARROW, UPLAND SANDPIPER AND SHORT EARED OWL IN LARGE GRASS FIELDS WHERE HENLOW'S SPARROW'S HAVE BEEN FOUND THE PREVIOUS TWO YEARS. TO FIND THIS LOCATION FROM HIGHWAY 1 IN KEOSAUQUA GO WEST ON COUNTY ROAD J-40 FOR 4.7 MILES, THEN SOUTH ON GRAVEL .3 MILES AND WEST .5 MILES ^{THE SCISSOR-TAILED FLYCATCHER AND HENLOW'S SPARROW ARE 2 AM ONLY} WHERE THE GRASSY FIELDS ^{START} AT THE ELY FORD AREA OF LACEY-KEOSAUQUA STATE PARK KENTUCKY, YELLOWTHROATED, CARULEAN AND PARULA INDIAN, AND ACADIAN FLYCATCHER. AT CROTON UNIT OF SPINNEY STATE FOREST IN LEE COUNTY, HOODED AND WORM-EATING WARBLERS PLUS OTHER SE IOWA SPECIALITIES. TO FIND THESE BIRDS, FROM THE TOWN OF ARGYLE GO WEST ABOUT 2 MILES THEN TAKE THE RIGHT FORK AT THE 4 AND GO 1.3 MILES AND PULL OFF JUST BEFORE A SMALL BRIDGE. THE HOODED WARBLER IS SINGING UP THE HILL BESIDE WHERE YOU PARK AND THE WORM-EATING WAS A LITTLE WAYS INTO THE WOODS ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF A TRAIL WHICH GOES EAST FROM WHERE YOU PARK. ON THE WAY LOOK FOR SUMMER

TAMAGER NEAR WHERE THE SIGN ENTERING CROTCH
UNIT IS SEEN. THERE ARE YELLOW BREASTED
CHATS CLOSE TO WHERE YOU PARK ALSO. OTHER
BIRDS SEEN IN THE WOODS THERE WERE PINE,
KENTUCKY, CERULEAN, AND PARULA WARBLER,
ACADIAN FLYCATCHER AND SCARLET TROOPER

RECREATION AREA BEACH A RUDDY TURNSTONE, SANDPiper
AND PIPING PLOVER, AND AT OAK GROVE BEACH 2
PIPING PLOVERS AND BLACK TERNS ON THE LAKE AT
COUNTRY CLUB ESTATES WHICH IS OFF UNIVERSITY
AVENUE 2-3 MILES WEST OF I-35. AT LONG
POND IN EXTREME NORTHEAST LUTHER COUNTY, 2

AND AT WILDCAT DEN STATE PARK IN MUSCATINE COUNTY, A WORM EATING WARBLER, 2 WHITE EYED VIREOS AND A SUMMER TRINGER ^{WAS} AT THE UPPER PICNIC AREA.
