THE CALIFORNIA GULL IN POLK COUNTY, THE MUTE SWAN IN MARION COUNTY AND THE SCISSOR-TAILED FLYCATCHER IN MONROE

COUNTY ARE STILL BEING REPORTED. I <sup>HAVE</sup> HAD NO FURTHER NEWS ABOUT THE SPUR-TAILED SANDPIPER IN JOHNSON COUNTY OR THE MEX GULL IN POLK COUNTY.

IN THE SOUTH CENTRAL, THE JUVENILE MUTE SWAN WAS STILL PRESENT THROUGH THE 21<sup>ST</sup> ON A LAKE WHICH IS LOCATED ABOUT

1 MILE NORTH OF THE RED ROCK DAM WHERE MARION COUNTY

A MEXICAN WAS SEEN NEAR THERE ON THE 19<sup>TH</sup> ALSO IN MARION COUNTY, ROAD T-15 GOES TOWARD PELLA. <sup>HERE HAS BEEN A LARGE</sup>

NUMBER OF GULLS, WHICH INCLUDED FRANKLIN'S AND BOND-

PARTER ALONG HIGHWAY 14 NORTH OF KNOXVILLE. IN THE WHITE-

BREAST CREEK AREA <sup>ON THE 20<sup>TH</sup> THERE WERE ALSO BLACK-BELLED AND LESSER SANDPIPER AND <sup>LARSON'S</sup> <sup>LOON</sup></sup> THE SCISSOR TAILED FLYCATCHER WAS

PRESENT AT LEAST THROUGH THE 20<sup>TH</sup> <sup>EVENING</sup> <sup>THE</sup> URBENT

RESIDENCE, WHICH IS THE FIRST HOUSE ON THE EAST SIDE OF

BONDPARTER'S GULLS, CASPIAN TERN, 1 BUFF BREASTED SANDPIPER,

SANDERLINGS, BIRD'S SANDPIPER, BLACK BELLED PLOVER, AND A

GULL WAS FOUND BY TOM KENT AT THE END OF THE

ALSO PRESENT WERE 1 FRANKLIN'S + 7 BONAPARTE'S  
GULLS, 6 SHOREBIRD SPECIES, INCLUDING DUNLIN AND  
BLACK-BELLIED PLOVER AND A FLOCK OF LONGSPURS  
YOU CAN REACH THE BARCOCK ACCESS BY EXITING  
HIWAY 96S ABOUT 13 1/4 MILES NORTH OF NORTH  
LIBERTY AND GOING WEST ON GRAVEL <sup>SUNNY LAKE ROAD</sup> 3 3/4 MILES

IN THE SOUTHWEST IN PUTNAMVILLE COUNTY, TODAY  
THE 27<sup>TH</sup>, LOREN PAPELFOORD REPORTS 4 WESTERN  
GREBES AT LAKE MANAWA STATE PARK AND 2  
SURF SCOTERS IN THE NORTH POND AT THE IAL  
GENERATING STATION, BOTH LOCATIONS JUST SOUTH OF  
COUNCIL BLUFFS

FLOCK OF ABOUT 20 AMERICAN PIPITS. THE ROAD TO SAND-  
PIPER IS CLOSED FOR THE SEASON AND YOU MUST DRIVE  
THROUGH THE MARINA TO THE FAR END OF THE PARKING  
LOT AND WALK IN FROM THERE. ELSEWHERE AT SOUTHERN  
THE <sup>SEASON'S</sup> FIRST SIGHTING OF SNOW BUNTING, <sup>AND FROM THE FAR WEST PULLOUT</sup> ON TOP OF THE  
DAM, AND AN EARED GREBE JUST ABOVE THE DAM ON  
THE 21<sup>ST</sup>. A WESTERN GREBE ON THE LAKE ON THE  
18<sup>TH</sup>, AND A SMITH'S LONGSPUR ON THE BEACH OF GAY  
GROVE RECREATION AREA ON THE 18<sup>TH</sup>. <sup>A SHORT-EARED OWL NORTH OF THE END OF 10<sup>TH</sup> ST  
OF BIG CREEK ST. IN BOONE COUNTY</sup> IN BOONE COUNTY,  
A CATBIRD WAS STILL AT THE LEAGUE STATE PARK ON THE  
20<sup>TH</sup>, AND IN MADISON COUNTY, 12 SPARRROW  
SPECIES, INCLUDING LECONTE'S WERE AT BADGER CREEK  
STATE PARK ON THE 21<sup>ST</sup>. IN MADISON

IN JOHNSON COUNTY AT NICKERBY HILL PARK IN JONA CITY,  
SPARROW SHINNED AND ROUGH LEGGED HAWKS, EASTERN PHOENIX  
AND 6 SPARRROW SPECIES INCLUDING HARRIS' ON THE 21<sup>ST</sup>.  
AND CAROLINA WRENS HAVE BEEN REPORTED FROM 3 SEPARATE  
LOCATIONS IN JONA CITY IN THE PAST WEEK.
